When was YOUR Baptism?

Today's Feast is the Baptism of the Lord, one of the many ways that Jesus manifests His divinity: another Epiphany. When we say "epiphany" many think of that one event, last Sunday, when the wise men showed up. But really, traditional Catholic theology also recognizes the Baptism of the Lord as an epiphany, as well as the first miracle at Cana. These are all epiphanies (revelations) of God's glory in Christ. And note, well: God's glory is also manifest in your own works of faith hope and charity.

This Sunday also marks the official end of the Christmas season. We now move into Ordinary Time. The word "Ordinary" doesn't mean plain and simple. No, it refers to the ways we count with "ordinal" numbers (first second third) the many manifestations of Jesus' glory each Sunday. It could also be called "ordered" time. Because Jesus was Baptized and lived and walked among us, our lives become more and more "ordered" to His. That is quite "extraordinary" when you think of it.

Look who shows up at the baptism of Jesus: Father Son and Spirit: the Holy Trinity! At His birth, the greeting party were only some angels, a few shepherds, the magi, and his human family. But now, at age 30, Jesus is surrounded by his divine family. Your Baptism too was such an event—part human and part divine. The symbolism of water goes very deep.

You ought to see a full immersion ritual where the person is fully immersed in the waters of the font, and then quickly brought out again. Immersion, submersion, and emergence. The young person is immersed entirely into the chaos of the water. Then submerged so that breathing is threatened. A sort of death. Then the person emerges from the waters of chaos, gasping for air, respiring for the Spirit, inspired for life and is filled with joy to be able just to breathe again. That threefold event: immersion, submersion, and emergence is the very experience of Jesus: the immersion into human passion, submersion into death, and the emergent resurrection into new life. His Baptism in the Jordan is a direct parallel to the passage of the human race through the flood, and the passage of the Israelites through the Red Sea. His Baptism foresaw His own passion, death and resurrection. It is a symbol of salvation for the whole human race. Every "ordinary" Sunday will reinforce that grace.

I encourage you to find out the place and date of your own Baptism: your spiritual birth. Make a note of it and celebrate it when it comes. Do what Jesus did when He emerged from the water. He listened. "On coming up out of the water He saw the heavens being torn open and a voice came from the heavens, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." He listened to His Father. You can listen too. Listen for God's voice, saying: "You are my beloved, I am well pleased" with your works of faith, hope, and love.
