Behold, the Light!

In times past, a new television series would debut in September, right after Labor Day and run new episodes for 26 or 32 weeks, until summer brought re-

runs or replacements. Today networks buy into short seasons that happen at any time. They take a chance on maybe six episodes and then re-run them to build an audience before committing to more production.

Our Gospel reading this week is kind of like that. We spent over two weeks celebrating the birth of Jesus, the visit by the Magi, and all the heart-warming stories of infant Jesus. Just when we are absolutely ready to throw out the Christmas tree and turn off the carols, we celebrate the baptism of Jesus, a young man 30 years of age. In our liturgy, we are finally already to put the baby stuff behind us and move into the life, message, and mission of Jesus.

Then comes today's feast on February 2: "The Presentation of the Lord." Suddenly it seems like a mid -season rerun. Jesus is once again a baby and now he is being presented to the high priest in the temple in Jerusalem. Mary and Joseph come upon a righteous man, Simeon by name, who was told that he would not die until he had seen the Christ, the Anointed One of God. He utters the great prayer known in Latin as the *Nunc Dimittis*, "Now dismiss your servant ...for my eyes have seen your salvation...a light for revelation... for all your people." This prayer is said daily by the ordained, professed religious, and lay people around the globe in what is known as "Compline" or Night Prayer. It is a peaceful prayer fitting for reflection at the end of one's day.

This feast of the "Presentation" is also known as Candlemas Day. On this day, 40 days after Christmas, the liturgical tradition of the church suggests blessings candles that may be used in the home, for votive offerings, baptisms, RCIA, or even the sanctuary candles. All these candles in some way call out to us that Jesus is the light of the world. It is especially fitting to bless the candles that will be used to bless throats on February 3, the feast of St. Blaise, patron saint of ailments of the throat. Like Ash Wednesday, people used to make Mass on St. Blaise day a priority. It seems we like getting extra "things" at Mass. Because the feast falls so close to Sunday this year, the priests at St. Xavier will be blessing throats after all the Masses today.

As a small child I always had the opportunity to have my throat blessed. I was concerned that the priest might light the candles that were crossed and placed against my throat, but to my relief they were not. I can remember the smell of bee's wax candles and the coldness of the candles held against my throat as the prayer and blessing were offered. I can't say that my scratchy throat was cured or that I never not sick, but it was comforting to know that Christ cared about my physical well-being, and somehow... I just felt better. — Deacon Tim Crooker
