

BE PERFECT ?

Since February 9th we have been blessed with the Gospel readings from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. Matthew tries to portray Jesus as a "new Moses" ... the fulfillment of what the Hebrew people had been waiting for. So, Matthew will write in a way that give us a hint about this fulfillment. You'll notice the Gospel of Matthew including many fulfilled prophecies that had first appeared in the Old Testament.

In His sermon, Our Lord uses words and phrases that sound rather lovely: you are the light of the world. But other commands sound impossible: pluck out your eye! The main point about the Sermon is that Jesus wants to show that he is the fulfillment of the Law. He wants to teach us about where the law ought to lead, that is, to a life of love and respect. Jesus goes further than what Moses taught. Jesus brings the law to perfection. "Be perfect," He tells us. Not meaning that we ought to pretend that we are perfect as God is, we are NOT God. We are human, and we always STRIVE to better ourselves and the way we follow the law, church teaching, and the moral roots of the faith. These are all given to make us grow. To be "perfected." In the same way that God is true in Himself, so we are to be truly human. Like a good wine, a human being will get better with age.

Last week's reading presented four pairs of "antitheses," showing that Jesus does not abolish the law but makes it perfect. For example, "You have heard it said ... but I tell you this." In today's Gospel, we hear two more pairs of antitheses on the same theme. The images aim to express an overall spirit of perfection rather than set specific rules. For example, that teaching about "an eye for an eye" is considered cruel, but the intent of the Mosaic law was to limit the violence: if someone were to pluck your eye out, don't demand anything more than his eye in return. There ought to be a greater love at work that goes beyond the simple actions of the law.

After having taught us the way of life that leads to eternal happiness, Jesus reveals to us the spirit of this way of life: love your enemies! Saint Therese of Lisieux writes, "Oh how contrary are the divine teachings to the inclinations of nature! Without the help of grace, it would be impossible, not only to put them into practice, but even to understand them." (Story of a Soul, ch IX)

What must we do, above all, to love our enemies and obtain from God the reward of eternal life? We must certainly start with prayer. It is through prayer that God grants us His grace, which can accomplish anything! As Jesus said, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." We pray to our Father in Heaven and ask him to draw us to Himself, who is perfect, holy, and sanctifying. As we look forward to the start of Lent, may we hope for the grace to be "more perfect" than we were last year at this time. And at Mass today, may we really mean it when we pray: *Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.*


