

Being **Phototrophic**

It's kind of funny the things one remembers from high school. People usually have stories about one subject or another that made an impression upon them. A lot of times it's biology

class. Dissecting frogs, insects, and pig hearts comes to mind. One word from biology class has always stood out in my mind—phototropic. It refers to the innate characteristic of being drawn to light; like moths, beetles, and other nocturnal critters. Whenever November comes around and the days are markedly shorter, I feel the effects of the lack of light and consider myself like those little bugs longing for the warmth and brightness of the light.

In this Fourth Sunday of Lent we find ourselves immersed in a Gospel story about light and darkness. The narrative of the man born blind is always presented on this Lenten Sunday when a parish celebrates the Scrutiny Rites with the Elect who will be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil. It is a time for all of us to reflect on our own blindness and whether we are drawn to the light—the Light of the World, Jesus Christ. As we emerge from the darkness of winter our hearts are lifted by the return of the sun and the effects it has on our whole being.

The word Lent means "lengthen," as in the light of day at this time of year. Lent is then the best time for us to emerge from the darkness of our lives, to shed the things that hold us back from seeking the light, to shed the actions of our life that we do not want revealed in the light. The holy season of Lent is a time to let the light dispel the darkness of whatever holds us back, cloaks us, and hides the true beautiful person God created us to be. In these times of pandemic fever, we are quite susceptible to fear and dark thoughts. Let us use the graces and lights of this Lent to turn towards and flock to the light. Let us be phototropic (or Christo-tropic) and bask in the rays of the "Son" and admit that we all want to be forever phototropic, grateful for the light that guides us.
