#### **Imagine Yourself With Jesus**

In his classic "Spiritual Exercises," Ignatius Loyola encourages us to try **Imaginative Prayer**. David Fleming, SJ says, "Imaginative prayer makes the Jesus of the Gospels our Jesus. It helps us develop a unique and personal relationship with him. We watch Jesus' face. We listen to the way he speaks. We notice how people respond to him. These imaginative details bring us to know Jesus as more than a name or a historical figure in a book. He is a living person. We come to know him ourselves."

I think the Passion narratives offer opportunities to "enter the scene" on the path to Jesus' crucifixion. For me, I like to follow Peter in the story. I love our very human St. Peter. He was one of Jesus' closest friends. He was the one Jesus chose to lead His Church.

In my imagination, as I read, I picture Peter following Jesus at a distance as he is taken to Caiaphas' to face the Sanhedrin. Peter sits by the fire outside. He is so worried about his friend. He wants to help Him, but he feels helpless inside, and scared, and nervous.

In your own prayer, imagine how you would feel if your closest friend were dragged off to jail to face charges you knew were bogus. If you were not familiar with how the "system" works but had a terrible feeling that this was not going to end well. In prayer, you imagine a stranger walking up to you accusing you of being a companion to this arrested Jesus as you sit in the courtyard awaiting His fate. Your heart would start to pound, and your survival instinct would kick in. "I do not know what you are talking about!" You'd turn away and try to blend in with the crowd.

In your prayer, you are approached by someone else who asks you if you know this Jesus. And again, fear makes you blurt out "I do not know the man!" You are so afraid for Jesus; He is your dearest friend, your brother. Your worries for him are battling your fears of what might happen to you. When the third person recognizes you by your accent, your fear outweighs your concern. "I do not know the man!" you shout.

And then the cock crows. And you run away from Jesus. You turn your back on the person you promised to love and defend. You are so ashamed. You cry bitter tears. If only you could have been stronger or been a better friend. Then you close your prayer time.

Responding to Jesus is the business of our lives. To follow him we must know Him, and we get to know Him through our imagination. Imaginative Ignatian prayer teaches us about Jesus, and our response to Jesus, that we would not otherwise learn through scripture study or theological research. Contemplation brings Jesus into our hearts.

As we travel this Lenten journey to the Cross with Jesus, take some quiet time to be with Him on the way. Wipe His brow, help carry the cross, stand at His feet with His Mother at the end. Let your feelings and your imagination guide you closer to Him.

## **Holy Senses in Holy Week**

One of the tools suggested by Ignatius Loyola in his *Spiritual Exercises* is the "Application of the Senses." In prayer, one selects a Gospel reading and applies the five senses to the scene. That is, first you read the passage, then reading it again, you imagine experiencing that scene using your sight, smell, touch, hearing, and taste. And you savor that encounter. Senses provide one of the primary ways your soul connects with God.

This coming week is called HOLY WEEK because we use our WHOLE sensibility, our five HOLY senses to unite with Jesus wholly. If you desire to try your hardest to follow Jesus this week, wouldn't you want to use every means available to you? ALL your powers of sight, smell, taste, hearing, and touch?

From our readings of the Passion, look how many ways has God desired to connect through the senses:

- · Those following Jesus kept crying out: "Hosanna!
- · The Lord God has given me a well-trained tongue.
- · Morning after morning he opens my ear that I may hear;
- · I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard;
- · at the name of Jesus every knee should bend,
- a woman came with an alabaster jar of perfumed oil
- · One bystander drew his sword and cut off his ear.
- · Peter was seated, warming himself at the fire.
- · They kept striking his head with a reed and spitting upon him.
- · They clothed him in purple
- · He soaked a sponge with wine, put it on a reed and gave it to him to drink
- At noon darkness came over the whole land You could sit with any of these passages for 15 minutes literally feeling yourself immersed into the scene. Your senses were given to you to enrich the soul. Don't take them for granted? Use them to raise awareness of God's love for you, and your love for him.

As you hunker down in your home this week, or in your daily routine, you might involve all your senses in this Holy Week:

- · You might turn off music to appreciate the solemnity of the week
- · If you have dessert, and didn't give it up for Lent, take more time to enjoy the taste, give thanks to God.
- · If you enjoy a hot shower, recall that 783 million people do not have access to safe water. Feel it.
- · Music. Find an inspiring song on You Tube and send the link to 10 people.
- · Eyesight, take more time to gaze at the stars and imagine how long it took for the light to reach you. God's love is even longer than that.
- · Re-read the Passion narrative again, but this time using your sense imagination to draw closer to Jesus. Desire to see, hear, taste, touch and feel what he did.

In that way we apply our holy senses for a Holy Week.
