

# From the Pastor: "Thank vou and Good-bve"

This Sunday's Gospel happens to be one of the most remarkable of the Resurrection stories: the Road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35). I have always liked this passage at the end of Luke's Gospel. For me it has been a kind of "canon within the canon." Which is to say: this passage could be the entire message of the Scriptures distilled in one story. So, as I near the end of my term of ministry here as pastor of St. Xavier Church, this Gospel scene inspires me again; perhaps it provides a fitting image for a coming farewell, and a soothing way to say **thank you and good-bye.** 

At the end of this passage, a kind of journey, the scene begins with sadness and changes into joy. We see two disciples who learn about how Jesus is foretold in all of Scriptures. Then they invite Jesus to stay with them, and He does. He stops at their home and sits with them at dinner. Well, the symbolism shows that it is more than just dinner. At the table fellowship, Jesus takes bread, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it to them. This is the Eucharistic feast. As Jesus breaks the bread, the eyes of His disciples are opened and they recognized Him. Just then, He vanished from their site. "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" In a sense, we have here a summary of mysteries: the proclamation of the Gospel, the Last Supper, the Resurrection, the Ascension, and the burning hearts of Pentecost all in one. All tied together with gratitude.

When I arrived seven years ago, like those disciples, I too found the Lord Jesus in the proclamation of the Gospel. We welcomed Jesus into our home, and shared table fellowship with one another. I found Jesus in this holy space. I loved Jesus as I placed His host in your sacred hands. Soon I will enjoy a "last" supper with you, and then you will disappear from my sight. For me that will be a loss, a time of sadness along the way. I will be grateful and in wonder. But then I hope to feel that burning heart. I will take the fire of St X and carry it to my next mission. I have found Jesus in all of you since the day I arrived, and I believe I will find him in my good-byes.

I will experience a time of "missing." I will miss that, and this, and you, and you. And especially you! And for all of it I am eternally grateful. But I believe an opportunity comes to me (and you) whereby the Holy Spirit might enter and fill whatever space is created by departure—whatever "distance" we might have to endure. For Jesuits, we call this "the grace of leave-taking." This grace helps us move on and announce the good news to other people.

Sometimes good-bye is good news. In that sense it is a mystery. It may look sad and unfortunate (for some), but a good-bye can also be an opening, a gap which needs to be filled. Any loss or good-bye can be an opportunity for the entrance of the Spirit to fill that gap. How will the Spirit bless you in coming weeks?

After Jesus vanished from the table, burning hearts took over. After Jesus ascended from the earth, the Holy Spirit took over. After I leave my hometown and all of you, I trust the Spirit to set my heart on fire for Chicago. Yet another Chicago fire.

So what about you? May the Spirit set you on fire to welcome those Jesuits who come next, in search of Jesus at St X. Welcome them and show them the Lord. They will stay a while, break bread with you, and learn how Jesus lives, although vanished. Show them how he lives here among us.

As for me, I will be taking up new tasks in August. Not only will I serve as the superior for a community of Jesuits, I will also serve the students and adults at St Ignatius College Prep which is where I used to teach years ago. As a veteran language teacher, I must add this pedagogical note about the etymology of the word good-bye. "Goodbye" comes from the Gaelic term "God-bwye" (God bu wee yuh) a contraction of the phrase "God be with ye".

The first documented use of the contraction "Godbwye" appeared in a letter English writer and scholar Gabriel Harvey wrote in 1573. As time went on, it is believed the phrase was influenced by terms like "good day" and "good evening", transitioning then from "god be with ye" to god-b'wye to good-b'wy and finally ending in today's blessing of goodbye.

So when I say good-bye I am actually filling the gap with God. I may be leaving, but may God be with you. I like that. Please take my good-bye as a blessing, and I'll do the same with yours. Thank you.
