HELLO! (Again)

Dear Saint Xavier parishioners,

I am happy to be back at St. Xavier Church as your interim pastor for the summer months. As many of you know I worked as pastor here from 1997 until 2005, and I have always kept a very warm place in my heart for St. X. This parish is an important work of our Midwest Jesuits, and is, of course, the original site of all our Jesuit ministries in Cincinnati. For so many years St. Xavier has been a source of spiritual inspiration and nourishment for people from all over our tri-state region; and it is a privilege for me to help this tradition continue and grow as our church enters its third century of service.

As an eighth grader I came from Erlanger, Kentucky, to Seventh and Sycamore to take the entrance exam for St. Xavier High school in 1960. Of course, when I actually started high school the school had been moved to its present location in Finneytown, so I had a lot of practice riding Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky buses for the next four years. I also attended Xavier University for four years before I entered the Jesuits. So my roots are certainly in our metropolitan Cincinnati community.

After leaving St. X Church in 2005 I worked for seven years in Chicago helping with the training of young Jesuits. I served as Formation Director for the Chicago Province, as well as the superior for some 40 scholastics and brothers doing studies at Loyola University. It is certainly a privilege (and occasionally a challenge) to work with the men who are the future of our Jesuit ministries in the United States and beyond.

In 2012 I returned to Cincinnati to work with several different ministries in the city. I was pastor of Mother of Christ and St. Bernard parishes in Winton Hills and Spring Grove Village as part of our province's commitment to accompany African Americans in their faith journeys. I also helped with retreats at Milford, and coordinated the lives of the lesuits living in our community by St. Xavier High School. So variety has been the spice of my life lately. Though I am no longer the pastor, I continue to help with liturgies at Mother of Christ and St. Bernard; so though I will also help with Masses here at St. X this summer, I can't promise to see all of you every Sunday unless my bi-location skills can be improved during the next couple months. (We will see about that!)

Farewell from Fr. Fairbanks

"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times." Dickens captured well the feeling of late 18th century Europe, and those are not so different from our own. At the end of April 2020, I am feeling too the motions of good times and bad. April 30 was my last day as pastor, and starting May 1 our parish welcomes Fr. Bob Thesing S.J. as the interim pastor until Fr. Lickteig arrives in September. It is with sadness that I depart, and I will certainly miss you all. I am most grateful to Fr. Thesing, especially for taking over amid two separate crises--the worst of times. The first crisis is obviously the Covid pandemic, and the second is my own health misfortune. Early Sunday morning a week back, I suffered a mild heart attack and was taken guickly to Good Sam to be checked by expert cardiologists. Via angiogram, they found a small blockage and decided it best to treat the ischemia with medicines. I am very grateful for their attention and care, and that I was out and back to the Jesuit community Tuesday afternoon. However, it is Jesuit policy that anyone who has spent significant time in a foreign country, city, or location of risk (i.e. a hospital) ought to undergo a 14 day quarantine before coming back into the house. So, I find myself next door on the campus of XU with 14 days to pray, relax, recover, read, take lots of pills, and lots of naps. Indeed this will be a time of retreat for me, "the best of times." I will be able to pray for each of the St Xavier parishioners, and I will keep in prayer any intentions that I receive from you. Later this spring, before I leave for Chicago. I hope we can arrange a time for a "final Mass" and reception. Although the exact time is unclear now, we will keep you posted as directives appear.
