

RESUMING MASSES AT ST. XAVIER

St. Xavier Church will be re-starting public Masses and Confessions on **May 25**. The schedule of Masses will be the same as it has been.

Be aware that the Archdiocese of Cincinnati continues to dispense all Catholics from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass. Those who are at risk or fearful that they or their family might become sick are encouraged to stay home and join the Church by viewing live-streamed Masses. If you prefer to come to a Mass with fewer people, you might choose to come to a weekday Mass.

Social distancing is to be observed by those who come to our church. Some pews will be blocked off. Those who live in a household with one another may sit closer together; but otherwise, a six-foot distance is to be observed by all, both in sitting and in entering, exiting, and processing to receive communion.

Holy Communion will only be distributed to the faithful under the form of bread (hosts). Please receive Communion in the hand.

All are strongly encouraged to wear face masks when coming to church.

There should be no physical contact at the Our Father or the Sign of Peace.

Weekday confessions will also begin on May 25.

SUNDAY REFLECTIONS

In the tribal community (native people) when the elder of the family or the tribe approaches his death, he calls his eldest or youngest son (as per the tradition of the tribe) to his bedside and advises him and imparts a final blessing. The purpose of this farewell address and the blessing is to indicate, who inherits the legacy of the family. The father admonishes the son to guard against complacency, to uphold the good traditions of the family and keep the memory of the ancestors alive. We see this happening in the Old Testament too. Abraham blesses his son Isaac, Isaac blesses his son Jacob (rather Jacob cheats his father and steals the blessing from his brother Esau), Jacob blesses Joseph and so on.

The gospel today indicates that **continuity is the core of the mission of Christ**. Jesus could have left the disciples to fend for themselves. That would have defeated the purpose and the mission of Jesus would have seen a disastrous end.



He rather appoints Peter as the leader of the group and addresses his disciples in his farewell speech and points to them, 'loving him' invites keeping the Word because of Father's love and the consequence of this is that the Father and the Son will come and make a dwelling in them. That is a great responsibility imposed on the disciples to keep the word and continue the mission of loving others. To fulfill this mission of loving and living his commandments he promises another Counsellor (*Paraclete*) whom he calls as the Spirit of Truth.

The Greek word *Paraklētos* means "one called upon for support or assistance," thus an advocate. By naming the Paraclete as the Spirit of Truth, the disciples are not left orphans. The Paraclete is at the same time a representative of Jesus to his own disciples. Jesus would then ask the Father to gift that situation of love and faithfulness with another Paraclete to be with them forever. Despite the physical absence of Jesus created by his departure, his revealing mission is not coming to an end. It is moving towards a new era when the revealing role of Jesus will be taken over by another Paraclete, the Spirit of Truth. Jesus is about to depart, but his disciples will not be left orphans.

Parting is painful. Like the disciples we feel lost and lonely, forsaken and forgotten. We feel we have been left to fend to ourselves. We feel we are struggling alone. We are tempted to think that we are praying in a void. "I will not leave you orphans." How comforting and consoling are these words! Jesus does not leave us orphans. He is with us as He promised to be – yes, even to the end of time, giving us His Spirit to befriend us, an Advocate to plead our cause and fight our case. Empires have risen and fallen, crises and catastrophes have hit the Church, her leaders have proved unfaithful and unworthy – through it all the Church has emerged safe and strong.

As we approach the Pentecost Sunday let us pray earnestly to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit by praying this prayer: **Come, Holy Spirit**, fill the hearts of your faithful. Enkindle in us the fire of your love. Send forth your spirit and we shall be created; and you shall renew the face of the earth. *Fr. Jerome Veigas, SJ*
