RESUMING MASSES AT ST. XAVIER

St. Xavier Church will be re-starting public Masses and Confessions on **May 25**. The schedule of Masses will be the same as it has been.

Be aware that the Archdiocese of Cincinnati continues to dispense all Catholics from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass. Those who are at risk or fearful that they or their family might become sick are encouraged to stay home and join the Church by viewing live-streamed Masses. If you prefer to come to a Mass with fewer people, you might choose to come to a weekday Mass.

Social distancing is to be observed by those who come to our church. Some pews will be blocked off. Those who live in a household with one another may sit closer together; but otherwise, a six-foot distance is to be observed by all, both in sitting and in entering, exiting, and processing to receive communion.

Holy Communion will only be distributed to the faithful under the form of bread (hosts). Please receive Communion in the hand.

All are strongly encouraged to wear face masks when coming to church.

There should be no physical contact at the Our Father or the Sign of Peace.

We are currently working with Cintas Company on best ways to keep the church sanitized.

Weekday confessions will also begin on May 25.

Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking up at the sky? Acts 1:11

Welcome back to the celebration of mass at St. Xavier Church! Tomorrow we will resume daily masses. What a strange, challenging, and troublesome time these past months have been. It seems almost fitting that we begin to reassemble immediately following the feast of the Ascension. If ever there was a time in the early church where the apostles must have thought, "Now what?" it was this event. Let's go back a bit in the recent readings in the Gospel story.

So first the Messiah, who the apostles expected to begin a new Jewish reign, is unceremoniously arrested, convicted, and crucified. These followers of lesus were terrified of what was to happen next. Then the women go to the tomb, only to find Jesus has risen! Over the next weeks this Resurrected Jesus reveals Himself to his followers in the breaking of the bread. He also opens the scriptures to them more fully so they might understand that He came into the world to fulfill the Word of God and to offer a new law to love God and neighbor. Just when the apostles were getting comfortable with these interactions with the Risen Jesus, He leaves them forever and ascends into the clouds. And once again, they stand there looking up to where He had gone and wonder, "Now what?"

These last weeks have been our first experience with a pandemic. It has caused people to waiver between thinking the sky is falling and that this is all a big hoax. Our children put us in lockdown. We have minimal contact with other people. It has been a challenge to practice patience, understanding and self-sacrifice. But look at what the apostles faced in that early church. Jesus sends them out to "make disciples of all nations" with the assurance that Jesus gives them. "I am with you always, until the end..." There was no roadmap to follow, except the Way of Jesus to love and spread His message of love.

That message is no different today. In our limited interactions, are we patient with others? Do we show understanding for the challenges others may be facing that cause us irritation? Are we living the Good News that Jesus calls us to share?

It will be a happy day when a solution is found so that this virus can be contained, and we can live our lives more fully. Until that day arrives, we need to stop looking up to the sky for an answer. We need to follow the call of Jesus and live our lives in faith, as though we truly believe that Jesus is with us always.
