If for any reason you do not feel safe coming to church at this time you may stay home and join worship via live-steaming Masses or via your private prayer. If you want to attend Mass with a small group, you might consider coming on a weekday instead of on Sunday.

If you do come to St. Xavier church for any Mass please observe the following regulations:

--wear a face mask to church

--keep a six-foot distance from others at all times

--sit only in pews that are not blocked off by white ribbon

--receive Holy Communion in the hand --do not touch others at the Our Father or Peace Greeting

Obviously new rules can feel a bit burdensome to us, but our goal is to keep ourselves and others as safe as possible during this pandemic. Consider these rules a small sacrifice you are making out of love for yourself and your neighbors.

In this Sunday's gospel from Matthew we begin a series of parables from Jesus, which will continue for the next few weeks. C. H. Dodd defines a parable as "a metaphor or simile drawn from nature or common life, arresting the hearer by its vividness or strangeness, and leaving the mind in sufficient doubt of its precise application to tease it into active thought." The subject matter is frequently God's kingdom of heaven.

So Jesus in these gospels is inviting us to think about what he is presenting, to let our minds move from what we already know to what may be new territory – a place of surprise, challenge, and perhaps wonder.

In the parable of the sower which we hear today lesus tells us about a farmer sowing seeds quite extravagantly. The seed doesn't go into neat rows in the field, but seems to fly everywhere: on the paths, among the rocks, between the thorn bushes, and also in the field. What might that suggest to you about God and how God deals with the world? One thought it suggests to me is that (in the terms of St. Ignatius Loyola) we are invited to find God in all things. God's life-giving seeds may be in unexpected places or with unexpected people. God is always greater than we think and imagine! So the parable invites me to keep my mind and heart more open for unexpected gifts and promptings of God. Certainly I seek God in church, in the scriptures, in the sacraments. But might I also learn to recognize the Lord in the immigrant family seeking a safe home, in people who vote differently from me, in homeless people on the streets of downtown, in people of different races, creeds, or nationalities.

Not all of the sower's seeds thrive and bear fruit. Sometimes my best plans don't work or succeed either. But maybe I just need to sow more seeds, try different approaches – to help God's kingdom become more present on this land. Maybe I need to be more generous, more trusting, more patient? Maybe I need to let Matthew's parables shake me up and change my perspectives a bit more?
