If for any reason you do not feel safe coming to church at this time you may stay home and join worship via live-steaming Masses or via your private prayer. If you want to attend Mass with a small group, you might consider coming on a weekday instead of on Sunday.

If you do come to St. Xavier church for any Mass please observe the following regulations:

--wear a face mask to church

--keep a six-foot distance from others at all times

--sit only in pews that are not blocked off by white ribbon

--receive Holy Communion in the hand --do not touch others at the Our Father or Peace Greeting

Obviously new rules can feel a bit burdensome to us, but our goal is to keep ourselves and others as safe as possible during this pandemic. Consider these rules a small sacrifice you are making out of love for yourself and your neighbors.

The Spirit Comes to Our Aid

Something we learn at a very early age is that it is good to have a companion. Children are attached to their parents as infants but soon grow in connection to their siblings (if there are any) and then to other children and adults. As we mature, we find social groups, peers, classmates, etc. that all give us a sense of security. Many find a partner to marry and continue that wonderful companionship ministry. Even those who do not take a spouse find friends and cohorts to share their life. These companions are so important in our lives, especially when we are down, discouraged, and emotionally or spiritually weak. It is at our lowest times that we seek the aid of our God. We call upon him to help us and remove the heartache, the anxiety, the loneliness, the despair that impinges upon our life. Often, we are at a loss as to how to approach our God for help. We are so mired in our problems and worries that focusing on the God who cares so deeply for us is just too difficult. It is precisely at these times, St. Paul reminds us that, "The Spirit comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought." Like a parent, spouse, or good friend who knows when something is wrong, The Spirt comes to us and intercedes on our behalf. It should be comforting to know that we do not have to form eloquent words to ask God for help. The Holy Spirit does that on our behalf with "inexpressible groanings," silently and constantly to the Father.

In the post-Easter liturgies, we hear Jesus promising to send us an "advocate" the Paraclete, the Holy Spirit who will be with each one of us until the end of time [end of the age]. Jesus does not make empty promises. With the Holy Spirit at our side, we all have a constant companion who prays the perfect prayer for us. That is truly a wonderful friend and it is good to have this companion on our side. This week perhaps we could be a little more mindful of this ever-vigilant person of the Trinity and offer a word of gratitude. And if we ever doubt that the Spirit is "groaning" on our behalf, maybe we could reflect on all those darker moments in our life and remember how we were guided through it all. We don't need to know how to pray as we ought, but we do need to know that God gives us the Holy Spirit for our benefit. Deacon Tim Crooker
