

Mass at St. Xavier

Public Masses have resumed at St. Xavier Church. We are following our regular schedule for both weekday and Sunday Masses. Welcome back to all who decide to come to our church this week!

Because of the pandemic you are **NOT** obliged to come to Sunday Mass. The Ohio bishops have removed this rule for the foreseeable future. If for any reason you do not feel safe coming to church at this time you may stay home and join worship via live-steaming Masses or via your private prayer. If you want to attend Mass with a small group, you might consider coming on a weekday instead of on Sunday.

If you do come to St. Xavier church for any Mass please observe the following regulations:

- --wear a face mask to church
- --keep a six-foot distance from others at all times
- --sit only in pews that are not blocked off by white ribbon
- --receive Holy Communion in the hand --do not touch others at the Our Father or Peace Greeting

The First Jesuit Priest

"Providence decreed I was to be Ignatius' tutor. We first discussed secular subjects, then spiritual ones. We lived in common, sharing the same room, table, and purse. As time passed, Ignatius became my master in spiritual things and gave me a way of understanding myself and raising myself to a knowledge of God's will. In the end, we three became one in desire, will, and resolve to take up that life we lead today--we, the members of the Society of Jesus. Oh thank God for my friend Ignatius."

On Monday, May 20, 1525, Peter Faber, from France, and only nineteen, went to Paris to continue his studies. At that same time, a young Spaniard, also nineteen, Francis Xavier by name, made his way to Paris. Peter and Francis entered the College Sainte-Barbe and were roommates. Peter was blond, soft spoken, not sure of himself, bookish, and scrupulous. Francis had black hair and was self-confident, athletic, well built, up-for-adventure, and an outgoing nobleman

Peter and Francis studied and lived together until 1529, when they were joined by another roommate, Ignatius Loyola, who had finally accepted the fact that he had to study philosophy and theology if he intended to give speeches, do spiritual direction, and preach. Ignatius was not too good in Greek and so had a hard time studying Aristotle. Peter offered to tutor him. One day, Peter revealed to Ignatius what Peter called "the cross of scrupulosity, introspection," self-doubt, indecisiveness, timidity, and extreme elation and sadness, optimism and pessimism" that troubled him and that he tried to hide. Ignatius revealed his own battles and decided that he would become Peter's spiritual director. Eventually, Ignatius led Peter in the Spiritual Exercises and the Thirty-Day Retreat. Peter soon became the most proficient spiritual director, "converting Europe one person at a time."

Eventually, Francis, Peter, and Ignatius graduated; and Peter, in 1534, was ordained. He was the first Jesuit priest. You see a painting of him in the first panel of the triptych in the sanctuary. Looking back on those days when he roomed with Francis and Ignatius, he penned in his *Memoriale* the entry quoted above. It is a beautiful testimony to their friendship. Twelve years after his ordination, Peter died at the age of forty, exhausted by all his traveling and all the assignments Ignatius had given to this "competent but not original" Jesuit.

Though he was the first Jesuit priest, he went un--canonized until 2013, when Pope Francis did the honors and officially gave him this feast day. He was known for his great devotion to the angels, God's faithful messengers and human's faithful protectors. With Ignatius' spiritual guidance, Peter found his own voice and his personal gifts were set free in service in the days following the Reformation. All this and more led me to take "Peter Faber" as my vow name and patron. I ask him today to pray for us all.
