## Mass at St. Xavier

Public Masses have resumed at St. Xavier Church. We are following our regular schedule for both weekday and Sunday Masses. Welcome back to all who decide to come to our church this week!

Because of the pandemic you are **NOT** obliged to come to Sunday Mass. The Ohio bishops have removed this rule for the foreseeable future. If for any reason you do not feel safe coming to church at this time you may stay home and join worship via live-steaming Masses or via your private prayer. If you want to attend Mass with a small group, you might consider coming on a weekday instead of on Sunday.

If you do come to St. Xavier church for any Mass please observe the following regulations:

#### --wear a face mask to church

--keep a six-foot distance from others at all times

--sit only in pews that are not blocked off by white ribbon

--receive Holy Communion in the hand --do not touch others at the Our Father or Peace Greeting

Then Jesus said to her in reply, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." And the woman's daughter was healed from that hour. Mt 15:28

As I get older, I seem to spend a lot more time in prayer of supplication. I find that I do not ask so much for myself, but for my husband, our children and grandchildren, extended family and dear friends. But today's Gospel reading gave me pause. I questioned how "great is my faith" when I ask for God's help?

The woman in today's Gospel reading was persistent. Jesus is seen in many Gospel stories rewarding those who ask and ask for what they need. While Jesus may seem somewhat annoyed at the repetitious request for His help, in the end He recognizes the great faith that made them continue to ask for what they needed and He gives them what they requested. Now we all know that sometimes our requests do not seem to be answered. At least not in our time frame, or in the manner we think they should be answered. No matter how very annoyingly persistent we are. But do you think we give up after a while and decide God does not really answer our prayer? If the answer is "yes", perhaps it's because our faith is not great. We don't know what the negative repercussions might be if the request we pray for is granted.

Faith, real faith, is trusting that God loves us and always, always wants what is best for us. Each of us is His beloved child. If we ask for something, I believe with all my heart that He hears our requests. But God...well, He is the all-knowing, all loving God. If He does not grant my request, it may be because He knows it is not for the good of my eternal soul. That is when I have to do a quick reality check. Do I truly believe in this great God or not? Do I believe in His passionate love for me? Do I believe He wants what is best for me? How great is my faith? *Kathy England*, Pastoral Associate
