Is there a dress code?

On a daily basis we decide what we are wearing for the events of the day. We may be just going to work or maybe we have a doctor's appointment or a meeting. We want to make a good impression in most cases.

Some occupations your dress is decided for you for the day. It may be a uniform either for designation or for identification or practicality. You may have a personal choice, as is the case of business professionals. Still some standards are set. When you have an event coming up do you plan in advance? Maybe you even stress over it, whereas to let others know you are/were there. It could be the case where you want to show respect i.e. a funeral or a wedding. The clothing industry spends millions in marketing and makes millions in sales to cater to our wants and needs.

As an Electrician, a few years ago Arc Flash became a big concern in the industry. At different voltage levels one was to wear different levels of protective clothing. In this way, each individual could work safely and meet all OSHA standards. Wearing all this extra clothing such as heavy Nomex coveralls and face shields and thick rubber gloves became cumbersome. It made each task harder to perform yet there was a sense of security. One knew they could perform their duties and return safely to their family at the end of the day.

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us the parable of the guest being thrown out of the wedding feast for not having the proper attire. The guest at least could have appreciated the invitation by wearing such, but he did not. The guest does not get to enjoy the feast due to his inattention.

The message I get here is an invitation to wear Jesus Christ in our everyday lives. The reward will be heaven (wedding feast). The other two readings from today tell us of the rewards of Heaven. At the same time they tell us that it will not be easy. We have to work at it. Nothing is given to us without a little sweat equity on our part.

Wearing Jesus and his message on a daily basis may not always be the easiest thing to do. When we walk into a room, do people know we are wearing Christ? Do we exude the sprit of Jesus Christ? I know millions are spent on spirit wear every year from the grade school level to professional sports. People want to share their spirit with others around them. Can you embody the spirit of Jesus Christ to be shared with others also?
