

What Matters Most?

Imagine asking Jesus, "What is the most important Commandment?" What would Jesus say back to you? Keep holy the Sabbath? Love your father and mother? Don't covet your neighbor's goods?

Jesus answers that question today and the answer is more simple and obvious than you might suspect. It is the theme of the most common scripture passage at weddings – and in some funerals: LOVE - the commandment "TO LOVE." Love is more powerful than clanging cymbals, gongs, and the gift of prophecy for "Faith, hope, and love remain—these three, but the greatest of these is LOVE" (1 Corinthians13:1-13).

In the gospel today we have a rare meeting between Jesus and a teacher of the law which is not confrontational. Jesus gives the scribe not one general Commandment but two: "Love God" and "love your neighbor as yourself!" Like two pillars the two commandments that Jesus describes form the foundation of our faith, our Church. Indeed, Jesus says that the whole law and the prophets depend on this. And so we strive to put love into practice. Yet sometimes we get one of these right and miss the other. We love God, but not our neighbor. Or we love our neighbor and not God. So a balance is in order a striving to realize the potential each of us has man, woman, child.... to love.

In working with high school students I often had to remind them that they DO have the ability - the potential to love. One Freshman said he felt unqualified to participate in a service project of assisting 2nd graders in math and reading skills. I convinced him he was more than capable. He took the plunge and the child ended up calling him "daddy" since the 2nd grader did not have one. Another high school Senior did not know where to start in composing a speech about "Love in Action" for a retreat. He couldn't think about ways he showed love. In our conversation, I discovered he visited a friend of his in prison. And there it was. He realized he was loving his friend - his neighbor.

Living and dying - on the mount and on the cross, Jesus acts with an "agape" love which is "loving others and ourselves as God loves us." Today more than ever we are called to love our brothers and sisters as God loves them/us. Can we pray to God to help us in this endeavor and, in the process, love ourselves too. For in loving me, God, you made me lovable.
