For All the Saints

On this the Solemnity of All Saint we have an opportunity to recall three things. First, we recall those people listed as saints, blessed, and venerables in the official annuls of our Church. These are the people whose lives demonstrated the response of Jesus' call to be good and holy people, glorifying God by their life. However, we also remember that not all of these people were good and holy all their lives. Many were converts to the faith and even more were born into the faith but set it aside for a time before they listened to the yearnings of their heart and turned toward God. These men, women and even younger children are extolled because they died for the faith, promoted the message of Jesus against all odds, voluntarily traveled in extreme conditions to bring the Gospel message to foreign lands across the globe. Today there are 1.32 billion Catholics plus our Christian brothers and sisters, who have been brought the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ by these saints.

Second, saints are heroes. Long ago in Catholic grade school the good sisters planted that concept in us. Superheroes with magical powers are not a convention of the 21st century mediums of print and film. And dressing up like our favorite superhero is not just a custom for trick-or-treat. The idea of "All Hallows Eve" (Halloween) was practiced long ago on the vigil of All Saint (hallows) to dress in costume like the saint in which one had a devotion. Sadly, this Halloween, I doubt we will see any St. Pauls, Johns, Xaviers, Marys, Thesreas, or Padre Pios. The nostalgia days of collecting prayer cards (holy cards) are gone. But not unlike baseball cards, they taught us about saints, their lives, and their particular deed. This "cloud of witnesses' to the faith gave us a sense of comfort that our lives can still turn out well, and if we have to suffer for the faith, that heaven and history will reward us.

Third, saints are all around us. I still meet people today whom I consider saints. They are people who challenge me, form me, and give me an example by the way they live. God put them in my life for a reason, I think I'm starting to understand what that is. My grandmother is a saint. You will not find her name listed in the Roman Martyrology, but she is saint and I have no doubt she is enjoying her eternal reward. You probably have saints in your family. Today's saints don't enjoy the stories and legends that history records of the most famous. No, the saints of today are the ones who practice their faith, encourage others to do so, work for change, advocate for justice, and suffer when those closest to them turn away from the love of God. As Catholic-Christians we are saints in the making. This day is for all the saints, those we have known, those we witness today, those who are still to become. We celebrate them, for one day we hope to be in their company.




