While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked. Matthew 25:10

When I was quite young, 2<sup>nd</sup> grade to be precise, there was an all-school roller skating party. It was the first such event that my parents were going to allow me to attend with my older sister. The afternoon of the skating party, my neighborhood friend invited me to her house to play. While I was there her mother invited me to stay for dinner and I was excited to be asked. My mom agreed so I stayed for dinner. I left as soon as it was mannerly possible and raced home to get ready for the skating party. I still feel the pit in my stomach when I saw that our car was not in the driveway. My mom told me I had stayed too long at my friend's, and since I wasn't ready my dad took my sister and left without me.

There is something so painful about being left behind and excluded from something wonderful. That is the message of the Gospel today. If we are not ready when the Lord comes, we are not going to the feast.

So, then the follow-up question is:

What do we have to do to be ready?

If we are to be prepared to meet the Lord, we

must have **charity** in our hearts. To followers of Jesus, charity is the highest form of love. It signifies the mutual love between God and man, that is made visible by our unselfish love for one another. Charity (a translation of the Greek word *agape*) is most clearly shown in the life, teachings, and death of Jesus. St. Augustine summarized much of Christian thought about charity. He said:

"Charity is a virtue which, when our affections are perfectly ordered, unites us to God, for by it we love Him."

Charity is much more than the passion or emotion of love. Charity is a radical commitment to love others with the heart of Christ. It is a daily habit we form by choosing to put others first, offering them all that Jesus asks us to give. It may be a small sacrifice or a heroic act of forgiveness. But whatever it may be, we need charity in order to be ready to meet our Lord.

The bottom line is: "Don't wait!" If there is a misunderstanding with someone, fix it. If you can help someone with an act of kindness, do it. Reach out to the lonely and forgotten with a call or card, even a text. Practice charity. We are His hands here on earth, and the time to get ready for the Lord is **now!**




