

Using God's Gifts

We all have various abilities, and in cultivating those abilities we learn valuable lessons in virtue. For instance, we might learn patience as we practice a skill, or perseverance as we (sometimes) have to practice over and over. We might also eventually find confidence in our abilities and a recognition of greater value in what we do than we previously saw. However, all of these things are secondary to something else our talents offer us: joy in our shared existence.

It is amazing enough that we are anything at all; human existence in this vast cosmos is an extraordinary reality. More amazing is when we recognize that we can do certain things well, and even do them in a way that is pleasing both to ourselves and to others. Joy comes when we find ourselves doing those things that we love and taking pleasure not only in what the talent gives us, but also in what it brings to the Body of Christ.

Something can happen to us, though, when we start to judge the worth of the talents we have been given or our capacity to use them. When practicing our talents, we can begin to wonder, "is what I do good enough? Will it be received well, or will I be perceived as a failure?" Rather than revealing our talents to others, we bury them. We hide parts of ourselves away because we are afraid, for whatever reason, that we will not be good enough.

We can also use those talents for our own gain, confusing our understanding of how we use God's gifts. Certain abilities that are "marketable" can allow us to amass wealth or create pleasure for ourselves, while not being used for the good or enjoyment of others. Even worse, we can use our abilities in ways that actually harm other people. Both of these expressions fail the goodness for which we are created.

In each of these cases, whether we fail to use our gifts because of fear, or we use our gifts for selfish and short-sighted ends, we end up burying the true good of our God-given capacities. Instead of this, we are called not only to practice our talents, but practice them in a way that serves other people. As humans, we have not truly received a gift from God until we have learned how to give it to others.

Your talents are not your own, they were given to you by our creator to do two things: they teach you to love God and help you love your neighbor. Rather than being afraid of whether our talent will be well-received by others, we can practice it for the joy it gives our souls. Rather than limiting the worth of our abilities by the kind of income or applause they generate, we can recognize value in how they help us to share love for our existence with others. In these ways, by learning to use our gifts and share them with those around us, we come to know more deeply who we are called to be in relationship with God and our neighbors. Even more, as we come to know the good we are capable of, we begin to share in the joy of our creator as we share in caring for the Body of Christ.


