Dealing with the King as Shepherd

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus, Christ the King with the ironic depiction in the gospel of Christ as The Good Shepherd. Are "king" and "shepherd" inconsistent? No, they are intentional and force us to reconcile and then celebrate their symbiotic relationship. When you imagine the word "king" what do you think of? Power? Wealth? A warrior? King of the Hill? King Kong? Perhaps, but think again. Reimagine the greatest king as a shepherd who loves his flock. This leader does not lead his sheep off a cliff, He herds and nurtures them.

The world got a surprise with a new kind of king in Jesus. Even as a baby at Christmas, He threatened oppressive power and corruption. People wanted Him killed. As a teen He inhabited temples talking about scripture with the big boys – questioning and challenging, and for three days He was lost. But boy, did this boy get found. Today He is all grown up. This Jesus stands for goodness and justice, uprightness and truth, human dignity and the value of the human person.

You could say that He's a Ten. He's a King. He's an Ace. He has staying power and will not be brought down by scandal. He will withstand the loss of popularity, even crucifixion. The Ace can be the most powerful card and also the lowest card when viewed as the value of ONE searching for the ONE lost sheep: you? Simultaneously, the Ace can be the ultimate valued card and supersede all the others. Whether an Ace, a King, or a Shepherd, Jesus challenges us to see him in our Church, in the poor, in our brothers' and sisters' faces - right here in our midst. When you see the poor, the stranger, the naked, the hungry, the thirsty, the sick - "there am I," says Jesus - like a Good Shepherd. We end the liturgical year with Christ the King - and prepare to do it all over again with his birth on the horizon. So split the deck - sheep and goats. Let's end the year and re-start again as He challenges our ideals. After all, He is the biggest "Deal" of all.


