### Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam



The feast of Epiphany is the day we reverence the Eternal Word being made flesh. We come before the Christ child to bend our knees in adoration of the divine mystery of the Incarnation. If you are still with me after those first two sentences, I applaud your tenacity.

See, for years, I found this practice to be too "precious" and pious for my more practical spiritual nature. Adoration was always dressed up in big theological words, and I was not sure that even the people who spoke those words understood. So, while I knew that "really" holy people were supposed to adore the baby Jesus, it never made sense to me.

When things started changing for me and the experience of adoration is when I read the following words:

"Nothing is more practical than finding God, that is, than falling in love in a quite absolute, final way. What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination, will affect everything. It will decide what will get you out of bed in the morning, what you will do with your evenings, how you will spend your weekends, what you read, who you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes you with joy and gratitude. Fall in love, stay in love and it will decide everything." - attributed to Fr. Pedro Arrupe, SJ

Here the author describes how reflecting on what we love above all else will shape everything about our lives. Adoration is an act of the will, but it is also an act of feeling. Adoration is choosing to reflect upon, and then falling in love *with*, the real goodness, the deep beauty, and the amazing truth revealed through our existence in God's world.

The "heroes" of this feast are the Magi; learned travellers from a foreign land, following the light of a star, in search of the new king of Israel. Metaphorically speaking, they are following the light of truth through the dark, across a land they do not know, to find the grace of God perfectly revealed in the world. In a way, they represent each person who truly seeks God...they will always find their way to Christ.

The Magi studied wisdom, and their search brought them to the feet of an infant in a stable. Herod, however, offers a different perspective. He too professes a desire to come and "pay homage" to this new king, but each person listening knows that Herod's professed piety disguises his evil intentions. Unlike the Magi, Herod reflected on power, self-preservation, and state-craft, and his reflection brought him to desire the murder of innocents. As the scripture goes, "by their fruits you will know them". What each of these people reflected on decided everything about what they chose to do.

What we choose to reflect on becomes the lodestar by which we guide our lives. When we learn to adore Jesus Christ, we reflect in a real way upon that which *really* matters: ourselves as dependent creations of God in a magnificent universe. The love we cultivate for Christ will lead us to joy, sorrow, celebration, and sacrifice. When we love that which is truly good, beautiful, and true, when our devotion is to Christ, the eternal and endless source of goodness, we find a subject of devotion that will guide and sustain us in all we do.
