A Remedy for Anxiety

Our wonderful St. Paul has been making a splash in our current reading cycle as we just celebrated the feast of his conversion this past Monday. We heard about his turnaround from "bad boy persecutor of Christians" to "good guy missionary" and the author of much of the New Testament. It is amazing how God can work through sinners and redeem them for greatness – like St. Paul, St. Peter, and so many – like you and me, too?

"I have one more thing to tell you," St. Paul says today in his letter to the Corinthians. Are you ready? He writes, "What I tell you is not meant to impose a restraint upon you. But it is for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction." Here is his advice: Don't be anxious! And Paul addresses this to everyone here – unmarried men, and married men; Unmarried women and married women. Basically to all of us: Don't be anxious!

You might respond with an astonished, "Get Real." Not be anxious? During a pandemic? During economic uncertainty? Having to home-school youngsters? Having to be a teen when yet another fun event is cancelled? This is not easy... to not be anxious. This ambitious request reminds me of what we read in Wisdom: the first step to getting wise is toseek wisdom! Is this easier said than done?

Cue today's gospel of a man with an "unclean spirit" - who assumes Jesus is going to destroy him! This person assumes the worst! He catastrophizes things that happen in life! He uses lots of exclamation marks! I don't know about you, but this is me sometimes. Maybe all of us in our anxieties could use a little bit of Jesus telling us: "Quiet! Come out of him!" (notice Jesus' exclamation remark!) - as we entreat Him to decrease anxiety and exclamation marks(!).

Specifically, in the gospel, Jesus approaches a man possessed by a demon. The man asks Jesus if he has come to destroy us? Hardly. Jesus has come to reconstruct; to rebuild, but let's get rid of that bad demon first. How? How do we get rid of the "bad demon" called anxiety? And avoid possession of an unclean spirit?

Answer: With authority – with strength. By believing that the impossible is possible and that what you propose to do will be realized – which is to conquer our demons and quiet our anxious hearts. Jesus looks at evil in the face and then calls it for what it is. And tells it where to go: Go away! Anxiety is not welcome here as he tells the bad demon to pack up and leave. Can we do the same? Can we possess authority to combat the anxiety and demons that lurk.

This reminds me of an African Jesuit friend of mine who accidentally cut off someone in traffic. The woman was screaming at him as she pulled up beside him and yelled at him. Then he rolled down his window and said simply, "I'm sorry." The woman was at a loss for words and was silent; completely stopped in her tracks.

Lesson learned: when a good spirit meets a bad one, who wins? If one speaks with authority and has a good intention, the demons will implode. Thank you, St. Paul, for encouraging us to have faith that Jesus can help us make this happen when we command his authority... and enforce it. Rev. James Ackerman, SJ
