Community Building

In the coming months, you will notice some changes taking place that are all about our ministry here at St. X, and our continuing presence downtown. By the beginning of March, scaffolding will go up outside our front doors and work will begin on a long-needed restoration of the bell-tower. This iconic entrance to our church, created over 160 years ago, will continue to beacon people to our doors, and to symbolize the consecration of our days as it tones away each hour.

While beginning a restoration in the current climate is far from ideal, as many homeowners know, necessary repairs seldom come at a convenient time. As a historic building, we have much to be proud of, but we also have much to care for. Over the past couple of decades our belltower has deteriorated to the point of being a hazard. Maintenance was deferred in recent years because, in a building of this size and age, there were other things that needed attending to. It is now necessary to attend to our belltower, a process that will take around 6-7 months to complete.

When Job asks, "is not man's life on earth drudgery?" our response can be, "only when the purpose of that work is about self-promotion, rather than our awareness of Christ." When we come to know the Spirit of God as revealed by Jesus, we begin to see that our efforts might always serve something greater than ourselves alone. In this way, a parent's life of difficult labor becomes the seed of hope for a child. An act of generosity and hard work by a previous generation creates a space to cultivate seeds of faith planted in the hearts of their children's children.

Part of our work is to preserve St. Xavier for coming generations. As Paul says, we are not congratulated for simply doing the good we ought to do when following Christ. Rather, it is in recognizing that our work is about sharing in the kingdom, that we see how our actions reveal a good whose effects stretch much farther than we can possibly see. We do not live only for ourselves, but instead to spread the gospel to others, if not "to the whole region of Galilee", then at least to the whole region of Cincinnati.

St. Xavier Church has stood, for decades as a place where believers could come and reflect on God's revelation in their lives. The nature of the gospel is not to celebrate the ordinary, but to elevate it. As a Church, we live by faith, to promote the faith, for the sake of elevating all aspects of our lives. We believe that no moment is too small, and no kind of work is too mundane, that it cannot somehow reveal the grace of Christ at work in our lives. May we at St. X continue to pray over the coming months for a deeper commitment to sharing our faith with others, mindful of our commitment to pass on "to a generation yet unborn" the saving power of our God.


