Another Lent has begun. For many of us we know this is a season focused on preparation. So, we are indeed prepared to hear about prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, the three pillars of Lent. We are prepared for programs—although not in person this year. The Little Black books help us foster our daily prayer life and give us something to contemplate. But is that enough to call ourselves prepared?

Lent is a season that highlights baptism. Since the beginning of the Church, this season leading up to the commemoration of the passion and resurrection of Our Lord was seen as a time to prepare and receive into the fold those who have been educated in the faith. The Easter Vigil celebrates the culmination of their efforts and, with the reception of the sacraments of initiation: baptism, conformation and eucharist, for those seeking entry into the Church.

At the beginning of Lent all dioceses normally celebrate the Rite of Election for those in the RCIA process. It is a beautiful ritual held in the cathedral church. Like everything else in the world, COVID has necessitated changes. That Rite is now celebrated in the parish. The ritual signifies that those who have worked long and hard at their faith are now embraced by the Church and will be called "the Elect." We can equate this to a political election as the one who achieves the support of the community is no longer called a "candidate" but is now called president-elect, or governor-elect, and so on.

But Lent is not just about those seeking entry into the Church as Elect. It is also about those of us who are already baptized and spend each day struggling to live a moral life, doing what is right, growing in our love and understanding of God, and caring for one another. Lent reminds us that we too are "the Elect." Our journey in faith is not complete. We are not complacent in our faith. resigned to be simply being okay to be a "candidate." Our goal is to be with our God in the community of heaven. Being a candidate for such a goal is certainly a step in the right direction. Being "an Elect" is better still. This Lent let us join in prayer for those across the world who have bravely taken the steps be a part of our Church, a part of our faith community. This Lent, let us join with them as we continue our own journey of being the "Elect" to share eternity with God.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person may eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are for Catholics age 14 onwards.
