Financial Note: If you are over age 72.5 and are required to take a distribution from your IRA, you can circumvent the tax law change and still, in effect, deduct your charitable gifts to St. X by giving to St X directly from your IRA. Lenten Fast and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person may eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are for Catholics age 14 onwards.

Long suffering. Perseverance. Zeal.

Zeal is a gift of God, a virtue that allows us to respond to God's call with passion, and without thought of self or of our own suffering. By the third week of Lent, the excitement we felt upon entering the season has usually started to wane. It is as this time that the practices of long-suffering and perseverance begin. As a reminder of what we are called to, perhaps it is also the ideal time to focus on the meaning of the elements arranged on our altar.

Sondra Clark, the creative force behind our church's décor, writes: "We wanted to provide a visual representation that Lent is a time for preparation, reflection, growth, and change. Lent often begins with a reflection on the temptations of Jesus and that is why a desert scene was chosen.

There are many symbols in the display to remind us of the sacrifice Jesus made.

- Purple: the liturgical color for Lent, a solemn color, a color of repentance. Purple is also the color of royalty.
- Bush: Dryness, Brokenness, and death
- Empty pots: No water.
- Empty basket: Fasting and no food.
- Branch with vine: Serpent (Satan) and temptation.
- Stones: Temptation (stones into bread).
- Crown of Thorns: Symbolize Jesus' suffering, and yet the hope of what is to come.
- Red Flower: Blood he shed for us."

Now, when things begin to get hard in our Lenten observances, is when these symbolic elements begin to make sense. We dedicate ourselves to growing in prayer, and it is hard. We might feel dry, empty, and broken. We might experience stronger temptation and lack of trust that God's grace is there at all. We turn to Christ and ask for his passion and his zeal! In sacrificing our selfishness for the sake of growth, may we trust that God will accomplish a good in us that we cannot yet see.


