Lenten Fast and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person may eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are for Catholics age 14 onwards.



Daylight "Saving" Events

A response I give to people who have asked me how my year has been is this: "There's been a lot of light and darkness." Indeed, the interplay of light and darkness is evident today as Jesus moves through his ministry acknowledging the darkness but urging us to move towards the light.

Today, we immediately meet Nicodemus – an intelligent Jewish leader whose occasional appearances in John's gospel signify the battle that Jesus faces, that we all face, between light and darkness. When Nicodemus is present it is dark as he serves as a foil to the brightness of Christ.

When Jesus states that we need to be "reborn" – Nicodemus retorts "How can this physically occur?" Setting us up for today's gospel. "Nick" initially doesn't grasp that Jesus is speaking spiritually. Often Nicodemus is "in the dark" metaphorically, morally, and physically. Perhaps we can relate to this present darkness. For in secret, under the guise of darkness, Nicodemus repeatedly meets Jesus perhaps to hide his identity as a member of the Jewish council, the Sanhedrin, who are in opposition to Jesus. Yet there is an earnest desire – an openness to the fresh air of Christ - that propels Nicodemus out of the darkness.

Later, Nicodemus will defend Jesus amidst the Pharisees as he urges that Jesus get a fair trial. He reveals the hypocrisy of the Pharisees asking "Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" In the end Nicodemus will support our Lord and assist Joseph of Arimathea in tending to Jesus' body after His death.

Perhaps this is what we all must do: tend to the Body of Christ after Jesus' life, death and resurrection culminate in Holy Week. To do so, we must recognize the dark but go into the light. And to not lose heart. Jesus reminds us today that "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son" - John 3:16. God does not condemn the world. Nor should we.

We can easily fall into a cynical mindset that Nicodemus represents. There is a little Nicodemus in all of us. We can relate to "Nick at night" often. Today's scripture passage includes John 3:16 which is often advertised as a sound byte theme to the whole Passion play. People have held up signs in stadiums (Rainbow Man), put John 3:16 on their face (Tim Tebow), on cups (In and Out Burger), shopping bags (Forever 21), etc. Can we move towards the light this Lent accompanied by our Lord and allow the example of Mr. Nicodemus to "redeem us"? Especially as we are enriched by "savings" that occur in the daylight.
