

Lenten Fast and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person may eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

"... but not what I will but what you will."

Mk 14

Several years ago, our son became very ill. He was hospitalized and the doctors worked extremely hard to restore him to good health. During the time when he was so gravely ill, I would find myself praying fervently that God would save him. Once while in church, tears streamed from my eyes even though I was not crying. The depth of my fear and worry was simply too much to hold inside.

Today's Gospel reading of the Passion is so rich in the recounting of the struggle of Jesus to do His Father's will. Before His ordeal even began, Jesus went to pray with three of His disciples. Arriving at the Garden, He went off by Himself. He fell to the ground and begged His Father that His suffering could be avoided. But even as Jesus asked for this, He immediately added that not His will, but the Father's will be done.

Jesus gave us the perfect prayer in the Our Father. In the very beginning of this prayer, we say, "Thy will be done." I sometimes forget about that line when I pray fervently for someone or for something I need. Often I go to the Father with the expectation that what I am requesting is a good prayer and that God should surely grant it! But when we pray that the Father's will be done, we are really seeking discernment, guidance in the circumstances in which we find ourselves. When we do not know what is the best way forward, or the best solution to the problem we face, we pray for God's will to be done We are placing in God's hands what we are struggling with at the time. It may be a financial decision, or a relationship that is hurtful, or a responsibility we must shoulder. We simply don't know what the best thing is to resolve the issue, so we commit it into the Lord's hands.

When we pray together, "Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven," we are praying for ultimate healing, for the strengthening of the hope of the resurrection, for victory over death and disease. The words, "as in heaven" become reminders to us that there is a greater life than this to which we aspire, where the will of God is clearly seen and enjoyed, and life in all its fullness is experienced. This gives meaning to the last days of this mortal life, and gives us the power to continue on to the next stage of life in God's kingdom.

During this Holy Week, let us fix our eyes on the Cross. Let us go to our loving God and pray that the Father's will be done in our lives.
