I am with you always, until the end of the age. Mk 28:20

During this past year there were many times when we felt alone. We were isolated and even when we were around other people, we did not touch or hug or see anyone's faces. It was a barren time and a time of great stress and fearfulness for many people.

Then we arrive at this Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. The scripture readings for today remind us over and over that we are never alone. Even in our darkest moments, we have our loving Triune God who has always been, and will always be, with us.

I personally have always compartmentalized the three Persons of the Trinity. God the Father is the allpowerful God. He is the creator of all we know and all we cannot fathom. He is the judgment God who will come at the end of time. I feel compelled to give Him praise and glory. He is my King.

Jesus is the second Person in the Trinity. He is the one in whom I place all my trust. I rely on Him for my day-to-day needs. He is my most intimate friend and all of my gratitude and petitions are directed to Him. He died for my sins, I can never repay Him for His great gift of Salvation. Jesus is my Savior.

The Holy Spirit is the Third Person. We celebrated His coming last week at Pentecost, yet He is the most difficult for me to grasp. I have come to think of Him as the spirit of God that keeps us all together as the Body of Christ. The Holy Spirit arises through and within all of us working together to bring about the recreation of God's kingdom on earth. Without His presence, without His Spirit in the earthly world, we would have no chance at overcoming the evil in the world and bringing all things back to unity with God. He gives us the strength and courage to live our faith. The Holy Spirit is the breath of life.

My vision of the Trinity is simplistic, yet it is as valid as that proposed by the greatest theologian. Our human minds are not designed to comprehend the divine. As Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians: "At present we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then face to face. At present I know partially ; then I shall know fully."

I encourage you to take some time today or this week to reflect on your personal concept of the Holy Trinity. There is so very much we receive through our loving God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. If nothing more, pray the Sign of the Cross. It is a wonderful reminder that everything we do should be done under this sign; in God's name.
