# We are the Body of Christ

It is so good now that we are back together after this past crazy year. To share in the Mass as one body without restrictions is so refreshing. The Eucharist



is the sacrament of Christ's permanent presence with his people. In the Eucharist, Christ is present in the gathered community, in his word proclaimed, but, above all, in the bread and wine transformed into his body and blood shared among us. As stated by the Second Vatican Council, the importance of the sacrament is because it is "the source and summit of the Christian Life".

During his life on earth, Jesus' favorite way to express his love for, and his desire to be one with people, was to share meals with them. He was drawing them into the family of God. He was letting them see themselves in a new light and become a new people. After attending Mass and partaking of the Eucharist, do you feel refreshed, ready for the world?

In the words of Pope Francis, "The Lord in the Eucharist makes us follow his path, that of service, of sharing, of giving – and what little we are, if shared, becomes wealth, because the power of God, which is that of love, descends into our poverty to transform it. Let us ask ourselves ... do I let myself be transformed by him? Do I let the Lord who gives himself to me, guides me to come out more and more from my little fence, to get out and be not afraid to give, to share, to love him and others?"

We act as one body because we are made one body in Christ. St. Augustine used to say to the assembled as he held up the host, "See what you are and become what you see: the Body of Christ." Every Mass ends with being sent on a mission. "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord". We have to carry the message of the Eucharist into the world. We are challenged to live the love we have experienced. We must become sources of nourishment for the world as Christ has become a source of nourishment for us.
