

## ASLEEP ON A CUSHION

Asleep on a cushion. During a violent squall, Jesus must have been really tired and/or not concerned



Jesus demonstrates trust and models that "Mary vs. Martha" lesson: remain calm, steady, and confident under pressure. If a "beta" personality is more laid back, perhaps beta is "betta" than an anxious "alpha." But then Jesus said "I am the alpha and the omega" – from the beginning to the end. And "chi rho" Christ is the "lambda" – lamb of God.

If Jesus is not nervous "on a cushion" as our gospel claims today, what cushions the squalls in your own life? The raging water? The danger of capsizing? May your cushion be your faith: an enduring trust in the Lord. How to alter/ transform the proverbial "hot seat" into "a cushion?" By coming to the altar and being transformed in body, mind, and heart - and restoring a resolve that God knows what God is doing. Who might help us in that re-calibration? Well there he is - he's asleep in the stern of your ship. Go wake him up. And boy does Jesus "get woke!" "Be still!" He yells at adversity! He preaches to the waves and also to our fears. Go away please!

Who else can help us? Our Father, God, and the other father figure we celebrate today: our dads. It's nice to have one around - yes? For security. Confidence. Stability. On the couch or on the cushion, a father figure is one whom we can count on even if he is sleeping when life's squalls seem frightening. Everyone needs a champion - someone to champion you on....urge you into bravery. If your father fits the bill, thank him today! Or if not, thank God. Our Father.

Fathers have been known to urge us to "chill out." Ask our faltering Job in today's scripture. In the First Reading we have God's response to Job's complaints about life's storms. God answers and He wants to know - "Where were you, Job, when I created the world?" "Who are you?" Why are you so worried, Job? Why so bitter? Why so scared? As God quiets Job -Jesus guiets his folks in the boat. He gets the JOB done. Like a good father does. Stand up to the wind - tell it off. Jesus models the good part about "being woke" - as opposed to being overly sensitive or fussy. Last week we moved from mustard seed to cedar tree. Today we move from terror to peace. Why are you terrified lesus asks us? Imagine the possibility of growing into confidence, and that, no matter what happens, Jesus is onboard your boat. This way we can decrease the terror and "here shall your proud waves be stilled!" - JOB 38:11
