Two By Two

Even the casual Christian convokes an image of pairs of animals whenever we hear the phrase "two-by-two." The story of Noah leading the animals into a giant ark two-by-two is so ingrained in our imagination that anything that references pairs in this way automatically triggers a vision of a long line of every critter under the sun obediently walking up a ramp in orderly fashion. Iesus sends his closest twelve out among the people in pairs, two-by-two. He sends them out to spread the spread Gospel message, to cure ills and cast out demons. It is from this action of Jesus that the Twelve get the names that history records, apostles—one who is sent.

Jesus further instructs the Apostles to take noting with then, no food, no sack of essentials, no second cloak, nothing but the sandals on their feet and a walking stick. This does not seem to be the way one would market an agenda or platform today. The bigger the glitz, the fancier the pundit looks, the more money he or she has, the better received is the message. But then again, Jesus has always been counter cultural. He instructs his closest followers who would eventually be the leaders of his movement to be simple and honest and forthright, letting the message speak for itself. Good souls and honest folk will receive the message and take it to heart. Those that reject the message are themselves to be rejected with the action to "Shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them."

There is a certain amount of spiritual liberation in Jesus' words of the Gospel for today. He reminds us that not everyone is going to accept his words and live by vales he set forth. Humans have free will. God exposes us to goodness and the truth, but he does not force us to accept it. How often have we tried to explain the faith, encourage family and friends of the benefit of the Catholic religion, or defend the theology of Real Presence in the Eucharist, only to be scoffed and ridiculed? Don't we wish the streets, houses and offices were dirt floors so we could shake the dust off our feet in testimony against them? But we still need to love them. The message may be rejected but we cannot allow ourselves permission to abandon all care for those who do not accept it. Jesus never intended that. Maybe he knew that there was still more work for the Holy Spirit to do before certain people were conditioned to welcome what he offers.

In the meantime, we who profess an unwavering belief in Our Lord do the best we can to emulate the apostles. By virtue of our Christian initiation, we join the ranks of "ones who are sent" to spread the message. The words we speak may not cure a cancer, but they can be very powerful in healing a relationship or offering comfort. We may not dispel demons (another image of fiery horned creatures), but we can help people overcome addictions and self-destruction by showing them the unconditional love of our God. And if we do all that two-by-two, how much more effective would we be?
