# What's for Dinner?

Recently my wife and I went on a short vacation. A friend cared for one of our dogs while we were gone. We received a call from our friend during our time away that our dog was hungry all the time yet wouldn't eat his food. Meanwhile he is throwing up all kinds of table scraps (provided by her kids) because the dog acted like he was starving, always wanting more.

What about us? Are we hungry people? In the Gospel today, Jesus is speaking about the Bread of Life. Now, most of the time, when we talk about this, we tend to focus on the "bread" portion of what Jesus is saying. Food is a good analogy, and an easy one for people to understand. But it's not just simple bread that Jesus is giving, as in last week's reading, it's the "Bread of Life."

What does this mean? It's not a physical life that Jesus is giving us here. You can read about what foods make you live longer. But people receive the Eucharist, the "Bread of Life" here at Mass, and yet people continue to die every day. The life that Jesus is speaking about here is our spiritual life. It's a life that's sometimes hidden, but which is much bigger and more important than we realize. It's the kind of life that remains even after the earthly life goes away. Bodily life needs food to nourish it, and so in turn, so does our spiritual life.

The Bread that Jesus gives us comes with a huge challenge. With earthly bread, the biggest challenge we receive is how much we have to exercise in order to keep those cupcakes off the waist line. The "Bread of Life" on the other hand comes with a commitment to a new life. A life following Jesus can fulfill that hunger but... As St. Paul says in the second reading, "Put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self."

Where do we start? Attending Mass, partaking of the Eucharist and Prayer. In Prayer I think of the old song 'Day by Day' from the show Godspell. "Oh dear Lord, three things I pray. See thee more clearly, Love thee more dearly, Follow thee more nearly. Day by Day."

### Caring for our Church

The restoration of our church's belltower and eaves is underway! Prior to my arrival as Pastor, it became apparent that the clock tower and box-gutters on our church need to be repaired. This work was delayed in part due to the changing of pastors and in part due to the pandemic lockdown. As it stands, the work is slated to be finished sometime in late November or early December. Please pray for the health and safety of all who are involved in this massive undertaking.

The planned restoration will address specific structural issues that have led to leaking and water damage, and it will also attend to the tower's edifice. The first stage of these necessary repairs will be to shore up any places outside where water might be entering the church. During the second stage, work will move inside to scrape away damaged material and refinish our beloved interior.

St. Xavier church is our place of prayer, our spiritual home. As with repairing any home, there may be times of inconvenience, and more than a little dust raised up. As work progresses from the outside to the inside, the parish staff is committed to keeping you updated. We look forward to a completed exterior restoration (first stage) by the end of this liturgical year!
