This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me... You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition Mark 7

Nothing would infuriate our mother more that when someone gave her "lip service". It was an old term which meant we might tell her what she wanted to hear (Sure, mom, I'll clean my room later), but we probably had no intention of actually doing it. This attitude is clear in today's Gospel. Jesus quotes from Hebrew scripture reminding the religious figures of his time that they may talk the talk, they do not live what they speak.

It is hard for us to do God's will in our lives, even when we intend to live according to his commandments. We really are no better - no more enlightened - than the people of Jesus' time. We often know what we should do, but when it is difficult, when we are up against what our friends and neighbors believe and practice, we only "honor God with our lips".

There is so much turmoil in the world, we look to our leaders to guide us and give us direction. But many times these people have an agenda that is far from the law of love that Jesus has given us. We must look into our own hearts and do the will of our Father. That does not mean convincing anyone of anything. It means to accept all others as our brothers and sisters with the same Father who loves us all. Our lives are meant to be expressions of God's love in our world. If we live that love, we will always be following what our God asks of us.

I have always found inspiration in the writings of Thomas Merton. He writes beautifully on what we should be about with our lives. He speaks of how we can best follow the will of God by living lives of love.

"To say that I am made in the image of God is to say that love is the reason for my existence, for God is love. Love is my true identity. Selflessness is my true self. Love is my true character. Love is my name."

Let's all try to be the light of God's love in our world. Let's all work to find the common bonds that make us members of God's family. Our hurting world needs less "lip service" and more loving actions. Be the love!

## **Current COVID Policy**

Please remember that unvaccinated parishioners are kindly requested to continue wearing masks when attending mass at St. Xavier Church. Also, based on the recent release from Hamilton County Public Health, the wearing of masks in enclosed spaces or areas of close contact is recommended even for fully vaccinated people. Parishioners of St. Xavier are encouraged to wear masks while in the pews due to being in close proximity with each other, but this is not a requirement.

Priests, Eucharistic ministers, and musicians at St. Xavier will continue to wear masks during times of close contact during mass. We will not return to a mask mandate or seating restrictions unless notified by local government or Archdiocesan offices. As conditions change, as they may from week-to-week, it is possible that former COVID policies will be reinstated. We are not there yet.

Please be kind to each other during these coming weeks as we try to respond to the current pandemic as a community. Remain attentive to public health recommendations, to the common good, and to our need to care for each other. Patience and compassion are not always easy, but they are the foundation of all we profess.
