# Be opened...

Christ often worked miraculous healings for those with physical difficulties to reveal God's grace. With a single word, today we hear how a man born deaf and mute was able to hear and speak freely. Metaphorically, it can be noted that Jesus, the Word of God made flesh, offers an opportunity for this man to hear something else. In the opening of his senses, the man received the Word, the One who came to save all people.

"Only say the word, and my soul shall be healed." We say these words every week. A friend of mine once mused out loud, "Do you ever wonder what the word is?" She then proceeded to go through various options, some were ridiculous ("abracadabra"), but as the conversation continued, the words she used became a series of words, speaking to her heart. naming the places where she herself needed mendina.

To a certain degree, our senses are limited. We might only hear the words we are inclined to listen for (it has been said that the most beautiful sound in the world is one's own name spoken with love). Some words we ignore (how many times might a parent call their child's name to come and do a chore, only to have the child appear strangely oblivious). In other cases, we might hear words we do not fully recognize. or whose full definition we do not really understand. This last case, I think, is the case for us when it comes to God's healing words.

We come to church because we believe that there is something for us here: something to heal, to soothe, to enliven, and to inspire. We say the words, but do we hear them? Do we recognize Christ, the Word, in what we say? Do we allow the words of the Mass to open us up, reach into those wounded parts of our hearts where pride, hurt, and resentment might hobble us?

God's words for you, what might it be? What are the senses you long to have opened? What is the word you long to hear? Whatever the word, it has one origin and one goal: it is in the Word of God becoming flesh, flesh in Jesus, flesh in the body of Christ, flesh in us.

### **Current COVID Policy**

Please remember that *unvaccinated parishioners* are kindly requested to continue wearing masks when attending mass at St. Xavier Church. Also, based on the recent release from Hamilton County Public Health, the wearing of masks in enclosed spaces or areas of close contact is recommended even for fully vaccinated people. Parishioners of St. Xavier are encouraged to wear masks while in the pews due to being in close proximity with each other, but this is not a requirement.

Priests, Eucharistic ministers, and musicians at St. Xavier will continue to wear masks during times of close contact during mass. We will not return to a mask mandate or seating restrictions unless notified by local government or Archdiocesan offices. As conditions change, as they may from week-to-week, it is possible that former COVID policies will be reinstated. We are not there yet.

Please be kind to each other during these coming weeks as we try to respond to the current pandemic as a community. Remain attentive to public health recommendations, to the common good, and to our need to care for each other.
