

Last week Jesus spoke of His impending Passion and Death, and rebuked Peter when the apostle tried to dissuade Him. Today He speaks again of the Cross and the disciples are "...afraid to question him." Little wonder, considering that when Peter guestioned Him before the Lord called him Satan! Fascinating, isn't it, that instead of asking Jesus what He was talking about, they began arguing among themselves about who was greatest? Perhaps, realizing that Jesus could be killed one day, they were trying to figure out which one of them should take charge, should His words of doom come to pass? And so again Satan enters the conversation, this time in the pride that erupted from the Twelve as each sought to claim himself as second to Christ.

So what does Jesus do? The only thing that can be done when Pride rears its head: He teaches humility. He brings forth a little child as a role model, to show them who shall be first in the Kingdom of Heaven, who shall be the greatest. For it was Pride that led Satan and a third of the angels out of Heaven; it was Pride that shut Adam and Eve out of Eden. It is therefore humility that shall be the measure of holiness, of greatness in God's Kingdom. Thus when we receive the humble and the lowly, we receive Jesus; why? For, as He says, He is "... meek and humble of heart..." and He therefore says, "...learn from me..." (Matthew 11:29).

When we receive such people, when we welcome the lowly into our lives, we receive Jesus who is also lowly, and when we receive Him, we receive the One who sent Him: we receive God, who is not only humble and lacking in any Pride but who is also the greatest of all. A profound paradox! But consider how our God, as great as He is, bows to honor and serve us in every moment. Consider that, for love of all, He gave His Son; indeed He created the entire universe for our sake, as a sheer act of generosity and love to begin with. When we empty ourselves, when we seek to love one another as He has loved us in all humility, seeking to outdo one another in service, there is room in our hearts and souls for our humble God to dwell: He who came to us as a child is more fully able to embrace us as our Father.

"You have been told, O mortal, what is good, and what the LORD requires of you: only to do justice and to love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God." -Micah 6:8

Current COVID Policy

Please remember that *unvaccinated parishioners* are kindly requested to continue wearing masks when attending mass at St. Xavier Church. Also, based on the recent release from Hamilton County Public Health, the wearing of masks in enclosed spaces or areas of close contact is recommended even for fully vaccinated people. Parishioners of St. Xavier are encouraged to wear masks while in the pews due to being in close proximity with each other, but this is not a requirement.

Priests, Eucharistic ministers, and musicians at St. Xavier will continue to wear masks during times of close contact during mass. We will not return to a mask mandate or seating restrictions unless notified by local government or Archdiocesan offices. As conditions change, as they may from week-to-week, it is possible that former COVID policies will be reinstated. We are not there yet.

Please be kind to each other during these coming weeks as we try to respond to the current pandemic as a community. Remain attentive to public health recommendations, to the common good, and to our need to care for each other. Patience and compassion are not always easy, but they are the foundation of all we profess.
