

"Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you."

So many of us are struggling, are suffering. We cry out to God in prayer, but we struggle to trust: is He listening? Why doesn't He answer? Today our Gospel reminds us that an essential part of prayer is *listening*. The blind man, like we so often do in our own prayer of petition, cries out to Jesus for pity, but he hears only the rebukes of the world. How often do we let the world play up our doubts? "God's too busy." "He has more important things to worry about." "You just need more faith." "Offer it up." Perhaps the seeming silence itself is deafening.

But Bartimaeus kept calling out, kept praying for Jesus' pity, and he heard that Jesus was calling him. Notice what He does: he jumps up, throws aside his cloak, and goes to Jesus, telling him exactly what he wants. He takes courage and "springs up"; the Greek used here has the same root as the Greek for "resurrection!" Imagine a blind man jumping up and running: he has such courage he's not afraid of stumbling or running into anything. Can we have such courage in our prayer? Can we sift through the voices of doubt and discouragement to hear the call of Jesus? Can we, even in our seeming blindness, run to Him, unafraid of whether we trip and fall over challenges, over our own shortcomings, trusting that He will raise us up?

Consider this: Bartimaeus would not have called out to Jesus had he not heard of what Jesus had done for others. He'd cast out demons, fed thousands, healed the blind man at Bethsaida, and much more: he had come to know and trust that Jesus was a person of tremendous love and compassion, and dared to believe that perhaps Jesus would love him, too. Hence Jesus' words to him: "Go your way; your faith has saved you."

Bartimaeus's prayer came from trusting in Jesus' love; his prayer was a response to what he believed to be true.

When we pray to God, when we cry out to Him for help, for healing, for peace, do we pray from this faith? Is our prayer a response to the love we now He has shown or, if this is a struggle for us, a love that we hope in? St. John writes in his first letter "We love because he first loved us," (1 John 4:19); when we look at a crucifix, when we remember the Cross, we see that He has loved us first, that He endured tremendous suffering on our behalf. Trust Him; He would not endure such a trial only to abandon you in your need. "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you."

Current COVID Policy

Please remember that *unvaccinated parishioners* are kindly requested to continue wearing masks when attending mass at St. Xavier Church. Also, based on the recent release from Hamilton County Public Health, the wearing of masks in enclosed spaces or areas of close contact is recommended even for fully vaccinated people. Parishioners of St. Xavier are encouraged to wear masks while in the pews due to being in close proximity with each other, but this is not a requirement.

Priests, Eucharistic ministers, and musicians at St. Xavier will continue to wear masks during times of close contact during mass. We will not return to a mask mandate or seating restrictions unless notified by local government or Archdiocesan offices. As conditions change, as they may from week-to-week, it is possible that former COVID policies will be reinstated. We are not there yet.

Please be kind to each other during these coming weeks as we try to respond to the current pandemic as a community. Remain attentive to public health recommendations, to the common good, and to our need to care for each other.
