Poor of Spirit

My mother was raised poor. Her mother (my grandmother) managed to raise her two children alone at a time when single-parent families were rare. Most of my mother's stories of her childhood involved her mom's hard work and how she "made do" with very little. There were also many stories of her helping out neighbors with a meal, or giving them clothes, or even letting someone stay with them to make sure they had a safe place to sleep until they "got back on their feet." Today's readings reminded me of her. She was someone who gave all she had, not from her abundance but from her poverty. Even late in her life, she found a way to give help to poorer neighbors who were in greater need than she. She didn't have much, but what she had she shared.

I wonder if this is what we are asked to do. Not that we have to be poor for our gifts to be pleasing to our God. But we have to be "poor in spirit." Actually, that has always been a phrase I had difficulty understanding. Shouldn't we want to be rich in spirit?

A famous Christian author was once asked this very question years ago. He suggested we substitute humble in place of poor. We should not be self-satisfied or proud of heart, but rather recognize our own dependence and need for God's continued help. Human beings are needy. Without God and God's gift of our very life, we would not be. God has loved us into being, and it is only God's love that sustains us. We need to be humble in spirit, no matter what our financial situation may be; and above all be grateful.

So often we are reminded how very hard it is for a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven. We simply do not realize what God has done for us or how He wants us to live. We should reread the story of the widow in today's First Reading. What made her gift so pleasing to God was her trust. She had nothing but enough for one last loaf of bread, yet she trusted that God would provide if she only followed His direction. Can we have that same trust and humility in spirit to give all we have, and not count the cost?

Beacons of Light

As you know, we are currently engaged in the Archdiocesan-wide process of "Beacons of Light." Recently, I offered an announcement at all of the masses mentioning how this will affect St. Francis Xavier Church. After corresponding with the Archbishop, the Jesuits will be working to find ways to enhance the relationship between St. Xavier and our sister parish St. Robert Bellarmine, at Xavier University. The Society of Jesus sees this as an opportunity to assess how we can continue serving Cincinnati, while being efficient stewards of our parishes' financial resources and being attentive to our limited pool of Jesuit ministers.

Presently, and for the next couple of years, there will be no change in worship times and ministry here at St. X. Instead, we will be finding new ways to create joint groups for prayer, various outreach ministries, and staffing – both in priests and parish ministers. For instance, we have had two shared-service days in recent months. This coming Advent, we will be offering an Advent retreat with opportunities for shared reflection groups.

In the coming year, we will begin coming together with Bellarmine church to discern possibilities for greater unity. The pastors, ministers, and parish staffs are very aware of the distinct charisms of each community. We see this missioning by the Archbishop and our Provincial as an opportunity to explore new ways to emphasize our shared Ignatian heritage, while emphasizing the unique mission of each parish. Continue to pray for our communities, and the other parishes of our Archdiocese, as we move together into a greater expression of the Body of Christ.
