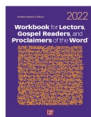

**The Lord Has Done Great Things for Us**

This wonderful season of Advent seems to pass as quickly as our shopping opportunities. We are but three weeks away from celebrating the Nativity of Our Lord. Each year it’s the same mad rush to get everything done. More than a few of us are already thinking that we have more presents to purchase, more decorations to get and display, more food to buy, order, prepare. We get caught up in the preparing for the festivities of the upcoming season that we hardly notice the one we are in. We do that a lot, don’t we. We long for the cooler days of autumn and barely enjoy the long hotter days of summer. We tend to look to what is coming and ignore the moment.

Advent constantly reminds us to be prepared, to wait in joyful hope, to set our sights on the promise of the future. But Advent does not ask us to ignore where we are or how to live in this season. We get the idea of preparing. We do that very well: our home, our hearth, our ritual dinners. However, we seldom live as people being prepared. Our entire lives are a process of being prepared; prepared to be welcomed into the heavenly kingdom. When we live our lives in this way, we can dial back the tinsel and lights that distract us from our journey.

John the Baptist tells us to make straight the paths in our life. He advises us to make low the mountains, those obstacles that hold us back. Obstacles like the material things for which we lust after, the addictions that we let control us, the desires for earthly things that consume us. John encourages us to fill in our valleys, the valleys of despair, of self-isolation, and of rejection of God’s truth. He tells us to clear the pebbles and boulders from our road so as not to let them become stumbling blocks. Our path to receive Our Lord should be smooth, flat, and clean.

Why should we do all this hard work? John, the herald of Our Lord says it is because when we do “all flesh shall see the salvation of God.” Perhaps John’s words need to be seen in the light that we should prepare ourselves so as to rid ourselves of all that is not focused on the real meaning of Jesus’ incarnation—our salvation. Advent is the season set aside for us to renew our attention that “The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.” (Psalm 126)
