The Gift that Keeps Giving

Twenty one years ago on the eve of the new millennium, I saw a film titled *Jesus 2000.* It sounded so modern, hip, and cutting edge. Indeed, the film took a creative license regarding today's Holy Day, Epiphany. In the film, Mary **saved** the gifts of the Magi that she and Joseph received on Christmas while in the manger. The film then showed Mary presenting those gifts to a grown up Jesus in his late 20's. She had the gold, the frankincense, and myrrh. I thought that this was a beautiful sentiment. Today we are reminded that these gifts are still popular 2000 years later, and that they, perhaps, made our grown up Jesus smile.

Do you have any gifts that were given to you "back in the day" that still hold value, significance, and provide a smile – a leap of the heart – an epiphany of a kind? What about Jesus himself? Who gave you your faith in Him?

Welcome to Epiphany. The word means "a moment of sudden revelation" or insight; a manifestation of the divine; a revelation – an "aha" moment.. And while gifts are given special attention on Epiphany, we are urged to hold and cherish our "giftedness" every day as Jesus is the gift that keeps giving.

Actually *Everyday Epiphanies* is the title of a book that a nun friend, Sr. Melannie, wrote. She mirrors St. Ignatius in his urging us to find God in all things, and, in her book, we are urged to pray daily on topics that range from the mundane to the celebratory events of life which could feature just gazing at the Eucharist.

This is what our Three Wise Men did in today's gospel. "They were overjoyed at seeing the star" - the celestial star and the star lying in a manger. Contrast the manger scene with another visitation - the one to King Herod who attempted to hoodwink the Magi for selfish gain. This was a tyrant capable of extreme brutality.

Today, may we turn our gaze to, and never tire of, looking for our beautiful star, Jesus, and appreciate the gift. May we share in the wisdom that the Magi and Mary possessed and appreciate everyday epiphanies.


