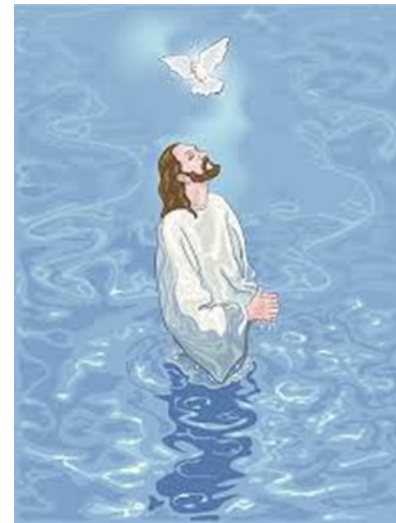

**ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT AND CONFESSION**

St. Xavier Church offers Adoration and Confession on Tuesday evenings from **6—7 PM**. Please come and pray with us!

“You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.”

Today we celebrate an event that might seem somewhat strange: the Baptism of the Lord. In Acts 19:4 Paul states that *“John baptized with a baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus.”* If that is true, why would Jesus Himself be baptized? Peter writes in his first letter *“...baptism, which saves you now...is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ...”* (1 Peter 3:21). How could Jesus have need of a clear conscience, being free of sin?

Hence the oddness of our feast!

But Jesus is not here to receive the benefits of John's baptism: He has come to make baptism beneficial in the first place. For it is part of God's plan that all humanity be bathed and reborn, cleansed from sin, by the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of His Son: at the very beginning of His public life Jesus foreshadows this by submitting to the baptism of John. He identifies Himself with sinners—Emmanuel!—and suffers humiliation by it just as He would, in the end, be innocently condemned. Even John sees this, such that in Matthew's Gospel John protests, saying, *“I need to be baptized by you!”* (Matthew 3:14): in essence *“I'm the sinner, not you!”* Then He is buried in the water, and rises up again, and a voice from Heaven confirms Jesus' identity as the beloved Son of God as if to declare the Father's love for the whole world by the sacrifice of His Son (John 3:16) but also a foreshadowing of what would be spoken at His death, when the earth—not heaven—would be torn open a soldier would declare *“Truly, this was the Son of God!”* (Matthew 27:54). It's all here.

There is more: as Christians, as followers of Jesus, we might do well to consider that as a sign of His love for us, Jesus has never asked anything of us that He Himself has not done first. Just as at the beginning of His ministry He submitted to baptism just as we do at the beginning of our Christian life. Yet in our baptism something happens that did not happen at His: He was already innocent when washed; clean, when cleaned. We are washed, the blood and water that poured from His pierced Heart carrying away the dirt of our sins. We are made like Him—*“For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ,”* (Galatians 3:27)—and being thus like Him the voice of God, now our Father as well, may say of us, *“YOU are my beloved...with YOU I am well pleased.”*
