

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Lk 4:21

One of the basic concepts of Ignatian Spirituality is to use our imagination to consider various scripture passages and to "put yourself in the scene" of the reading. I think today's Gospel makes this use of imagination a good spiritual exercise.

Here is this man from Nazareth, coming back home after preaching and healing throughout Galilee. He is known to these people since he was a young boy, helping his father Joseph with his carpentry work. He had been away from home for some years, but surely word trickled back to his hometown. Rumors of miracles and preaching, of vast crowds following him. And now he is in the local temple. It is a place He was probably seen many times over the years.

But this time it is different. This time Jesus is speaking with authority. He reads the words of Isaiah. And then he calmly announces, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing."

What are his neighbors thinking? What if a local religious celebrity, someone well known to you, walked up to the ambo, read these Old Testament words, and then calmly told the congregation that this scripture passage announcing a Messiah was fulfilled? How would the people react? How would vou react?

My first thought was that Jesus had such courage and conviction that He did not care what anyone thought of His actions. Then I remembered the rest of Luke's scripture passage that follows. "When the people in the synagogue heard this, they were filled with fury. They rose up and drove *Him out of town*" Jesus was not accepted in His hometown of Nazareth. The people did not accept His revelation to them, and He went away.

Within that scene, I am afraid I may have been part of the disbelieving crowd. I want to think that my faith would have been great enough to recognize Jesus as the Messiah. But I also tend to be a cynic, so I very well might have been part of the crowd pushing Him out of the city.


Today's Gospel is really a recognition of our degree of faith in Jesus. Do we truly believe that He is the way, the truth, and the life? Do we believe in Him as our personal Savior? It is a good reflection to really think about the strength of our belief. Where do we stand as a follower of this Christ? Do we invite Him to stay, or push Him away?
