## "The Transforming Power of Love"

In the 1984 film "Ghostbusters" there is a scene in which one of the heroes, an optimistic scientist named Ray Stanz, confronts an ancient deity set on destroying New York City, politely demanding that it return to its place of origin. The creature asks in a grave voice, "Are you a god?" Confused, Ray answers, "No?" to which the creature replies, "Then...die!" just before zapping him and the other Ghostbusters with lightning from its fingertips. It is a comedic moment; afterwards another Ghostbusters chides him, saying, "Ray, if someone asks you if you're a god, you say

And though it is, again, meant to be comedic, Ray's teammate isn't far off the mark: for as Christians we could in the same situation, if someone asks us if we are a god, at least answer, "Not Quite!" For our baptism is the beginning not only of a relationship with God and His Church, but it begins a transformation into something—someone—new. As St. Athanasius famously taught, "God became man that man might become God."

But becoming like God is more than just grace working upon our human nature: we must seek to live as God lives, to keep the Great Commandment "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another," (John 13:34). In our Gospel today Jesus tells us how to do this, how to love others as He has loved us. "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you..." St. Paul writes, "... God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us," (Romans 5:8). We struck Him down on the Cross: He promises to raise us up. The soldiers stripped Him, taking His tunic; Scripture says "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ," (Galatians 3:27). We demanded everything He had; He gave it all and demanded nothing back. He treated us as He hoped we might treat Him, He loves those who hate Him, does good to those who do evil, gives grace without expectation of repayment.

Want to know how to be like Jesus? Reflect upon how He has loved you, and do likewise to others, and trust in the words of St. John who writes, "Beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is," (1 John 3:2).
