Listen and Learn

"This is my chosen Son; listen to him." Today's Gospel gives us yet another powerful image of a future hope of life in Christ. As Peter, James and John saw Jesus' divinity revealed, their attitudes to Jesus must have been transformed just as they saw Jesus was transformed. We could say that is what Lent is all about, transforming ourselves and our attitudes so that we can see Jesus more clearly. We are not so lucky to witness the transfiguration or hear a voice from a cloud. We must have faith. We must listen and learn from the Word that is Jesus Christ.

What does active listening and learning involve? Active listening is fully concentrating on what is being said rather than just passively 'hearing' the message of the speaker. Active listening requires being 100% in the moment. Listening is not something that just happens (that is hearing), listening is an active process in which a conscious decision is made to listen and to understand the messages of the speaker. Once you have heard the message there should be a period of reflection. We can then take notice whether we were paying attention, remembering the message and think about/reason.


Jesus' messages through scripture may be hard for the ordinary lay person such as you or me. Thanks to Guttenberg and the printing press we have access to the word. The Catholic Church has created numerous publications over the centuries to help us understand. Everything from Papal Encyclicals to books to reference guides. All we have to do is read and listen to the messages gleaned from the words of Christ. St. Ignatius set the example. As he lie in bed with his cannonball injury, he read books on the life of Christ. Ignatius goes deeply into reflection and creates his Spiritual Exercises. He then goes on and creates the Society of Jesus.

So where do we go? Everything is on line now. Any Papal Encyclical, any document produced by the Catholic Church or any book is pretty much available through the libraries or of course Amazon. The 'Didache Bible' which comes with commentaries based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church is available through Ignatius Press. It helps explain different passages throughout the Bible. Lastly, my favorite is 'The Catholic Prayer Bible' Lectio Divina Edition. In this particular edition, we are to read a section or chapter and it helps us to "Reflect, to Pray, to Act". *Mr. Chris Dole*

The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday.
