# "Let him easter in us, be a dayspring to the dimness of us, be a crimson-cresseted east..."

## ~ Gerard Manley Hopkins, SJ

Perhaps it seems strange to open a reflection on Easter with a line from Hopkins revered poem "The Wreck of the Deutschland". It is a poem about maritime tragedy, but ultimately a poem about trust and courage. Hopkins, in his enigmatic way, speaks the simple hope of all people facing the dark struggles present in human lives. May we let Him rise in us, let Him be like first light in our darkness, let Him orient us towards the coming of a new day.

We let Him rise in us every time we see the world through eyes of hope. Inundated in recent years with revelations of tragedy and prophecies of peril, we do not close our eyes. We allow Christ to transform our vision, that we might be moved to respond with courage and compassion. We let him stir our soul.

In Christ, our eyes accustom to those glimmering moments of faith that bring purpose and meaning into our dim realities. The more we search for him, the more his light reveals the contours and shapes of the good that fills our lives. We allow the coming light to grow in our lives, like those awaiting the dawn. We awaken to new possibilities.

We turn to Christ who is the light in the darkness, the light that will never be overcome. The light he offers breaks upon our hearts, revealing the warmth of a new day, a new life. There, in the presence of his love, our lives are revealed, and the good within us continues to grow. Let us rise.

We must choose to let Him easter in us: to resurrect, transform, and enliven us. While Easter is an event that occurred with His rising from the dead, it is an event that continues when we allow ourselves to say "Yes. I believe." May we all, this Easter season, let him rise in us. Let His love be like the warm arrival of a Spring day. Let his light guide us in all that we do, allowing us to acknowledge in all we see, the slow dawn of His grace into this world.

Christ is risen! Let him easter in us!
