"Touching the Heart of Jesus"



Today is Divine Mercy Sunday, so named by Pope St. John Paul II in answer to the wishes of St. Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who died in 1938 after many years of revelations from Jesus regarding His desire for the world to know of His Divine

Mercy. In the diary of St. Faustina Jesus says to her, "Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to our neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to absolve yourself from it."

"Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful," (Luke 6:36) Jesus says, and says it still. Today's feast is not only a day to consider the tremendous mercy God has shown us through His Son and our need for that mercy, but how we must share that mercy with others. We might recall the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant (Matthew 18:21-35) when the king, having witnessed the heartlessness of the servant he had just forgiven, says, "Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?" (Matthew 18:33). Jesus has shown us tremendous mercy; recall the last time you went to confession and accused yourself of your own sins. In an earthly, human court our lawyer would hang his head in defeat; how could he defend you if you just plead quilty to every crime? The judge would scoff; now he must sentence you, since you have admitted your own guilt to every charge, and then some!

Yet there, in the unassuming courtroom of the confessional, your guardian angel begs you to plead quilty, while your accuser, Satan, seduces you into believing in your own innocence. Your Judge hears your self-accusation and declares "Guilty!", dropping His gavel of justice not upon you, but upon His Son, who yielded to a Roman hammer for your sake, though He was innocent of any sin. Your sentence in this Court of Mercy? Some small penance, and you are free to go; you have already been ransomed (Matthew 20:28) and your debts paid. But all this is for nothing if we are not ourselves merciful, for as St. James writes, "For the judgement is merciless to one who has not shown mercy; mercy triumphs over judgement," (James 2:13). Today as we give thanks for the mercy shown to us, let us be merciful to one another.
