## "Receive the Holy Spirit"

Today the Church celebrates her 1,989<sup>th</sup> birthday; today she celebrates Pentecost. The word "Pentecost" comes from the Greek word for "fiftieth" and is a reference to the lewish festival of Shavuot or "The Feast of Weeks." It is a harvest festival that is celebrated for seven weeks and one day after the first day of Passover, which is why Jerusalem was packed with pilgrims at the time the Apostles and a number of other disciples were still dwelling in the Upper Room. As the old harvest festival concluded, a new harvest would begin: "The harvest is abun*dant..."* (Luke 10:2) Jesus says, and we read that on the day of Pentecost that the apostles had a tremendous harvest indeed: "Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand persons were added that day," (Acts 2:41).

But this harvest did not involve scythes, in cutting any thing or anyone down: it was a harvest unlike any other. There was a "...strong driving wind ... " that shook the hearts of the people such that it was like fruit falling off the tree into the hands of the harvesters; there were tongues of fire, clearing out the weeds and all that was dead so that new life could spring up. It was less like a harvest of wheat or fruit, but more like a harvest of fish; indeed we can imagine Peter, as the people came forward begging for baptism, remembering that day on the sea when he and his friends cast their net "...and were not able to pull it in because of the large number of fish...even though there were so many, the net was not torn," (John 21:6, 11).

Today is the birthday of the Church because it was the first time the apostles went out to preach the Gospel, which is precisely what the Church is meant to do. We see also that from the very beginning the Church is Catholic—from the Greek meaning "universal"—for though its first members were all lews from Palestine, the second generation included people from all over the known world. The ancient prophecy of Joel had come to pass: "I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh," (Joel 3:1). Thus even those who were not members of the covenant were now drawn into the love of God, for "the Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God." (Romans 8:16). That is the great gift of God to the world through His Church: the gift of Himself as the Father of all, that we might become His children, "...and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ ... " (Romans 8:17).
