### Corpus Christi

If you have ever spent time with a very ill person, you know that the first concern is making sure that the patient eats. Even a small amount of food can sustain human life, but when the person refuses to eat, the caregiver knows that the end is in sight.

Today we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, or as it was known *Corpus Christi*. This is the spiritual food that Jesus offers to each of us to help sustain us on our journey. And just like the very ill person, we are most in need of this food when we are feeling spiritually distressed. We have this wonderful meal available to us, but many of us do not appreciate that this food will give us abundant life – if we just come to the table.

We come to worship God through Jesus because we are hungry. Like the disciples in today's Gospel, we have a hunger for God in our daily lives. The crowd came to hear the words of Jesus and were so moved by them they were able to put His words into action. Their hunger was not only for food for their stomachs, but also from their desire for meaning in their daily lives. Jesus shows them that real meaning in life can only come when they put into action the words of life they heard and digested.

In this miracle, Jesus does not produce food out of nothing. Rather he takes the little that the disciples have, and He multiplies it a thousand-fold. No matter how little we think we have to give, once we freely place our gifts in the service of Jesus, they become limitless.

Many people had brought food with them as they followed Jesus to hear His teachings, But they did not want to share it, until the disciples led the way with their five loaves and two fish. The true miracle is that Jesus turned selfish, suspicious people into generous people who were happy to share – a greater miracle than multiplying bread.

The Eucharist is a powerful gift and sacrament. Unless we actually live what we believe, we reduce and limit this gift of God. We remain hungry for the meaning that comes from the sure knowledge of God with us. When we come to realize that the Eucharist is both source of consolation and the completion of all that we do and how we perceive the world, we grow in happiness and holiness.

We all are the Body of Christ. We all have gifts to share – whether time, treasure, or talents. When we bring ourselves to the eucharistic table, we are asked to become the Body of Christ. Let's look for ways to be bread for our neighbors and share what we have been given – let us become what we receive.


