"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" Luke 12:49

Forest fires used to be an occasional summer phenomenon that typically happened in the southwest for a few months every year. Today, forest fires happen year-round throughout the United States causing severe damage to people and property. These types of fires are destructive and cause terrible suffering to the people impacted.

Yet fire is also one of nature's most essential agents of change. Fire is an important part of maintaining diverse and healthy forests. When fires burn in appropriate intervals, they consume leaf litter and other ground vegetation like dead wood. This can trigger a rebirth of forests. Fire also helps thin the forest canopy and cultivate the forest floor. Sunlight-dependent native plants are overtaken by those that like shade, and the whole forest becomes less diverse, denser from undergrowth, and littered with dead plant material without fire.

"Go forth and set the world on fire." St. Ignatius of Loyola is credited with saying.

St. Ignatius wanted his followers to go out and spread the fire of the Holy Spirit with everyone they could. He wanted them to help people connect with God on a deeper, more spiritual level. He wanted them to teach other people how to go beyond Sunday and live out their faith daily.

That is our goal too - to develop our faith beyond Sunday and live it daily. And then share that faith with others so they can do the same. That is how we "rebuild" the Church - with every thought and action, one step at a time.

People are not as impressed with our deep theological knowledge and theories as we might think. We may even bore them with our conversation. They won't be moved to faith by being lectured. The example of our lives is what truly inspires people to learn more about God. How we love God, ourselves, and one another is what really has meaning.

Are we going out into the world to set it on fire with the Holy Spirit – sharing the Good News through both our words and our actions? Or are we living a life that does just the opposite? Are we gently blowing on the embers of faith in ourselves and others? Are we a forest fire, clearing up dead brush from the forest floor of our souls to allow more growth, and clearing the canopy of our forest to allow God's light and love to shine through more clearly?

If you're struggling with that, don't worry. We all do! Before we focus on how we should impact others, let's make sure that our own "forest" is in good shape. Then *Go forth and set the world on fire!*
