"Table Manners"

Two weeks ago we were told by Jesus to "be like servants who await



their master's return from a wedding." In today's Gospel we are invited to a wedding banguet. Yet the seating arrangements are unusual: they are not assigned, but we are to take the lowest place. In other words, while our instinct is usually to take the seat in a room that is most comfortable or convenient, Jesus says that at this feast, we are to resist that instinct and instead choose the lowest place. This is because were we to pick the seat we prefer, we might end up taking the seat of an important quest, and we'd be embarrassed to have to move. But there is also a chance that the host will move us to a better seat, perhaps a great seat. Imagine boarding a crowded flight and having to sit in the middle of the back row near the bathroom, but then you get bumped up to first class!

Why this advice? To underline how things will work at the real wedding feast: the Wedding Feast of the Lamb we hear of in Revelation 19:7. Indeed an angel says, "Blessed are those who have been called to the wedding feast of the Lamb!" (Revelation 19:9), words we hear almost verbatim at every Mass, which is a foretaste of this great feast. But it is not a feast for the proud: notice at Mass that everyone is seated as equals. There are no box seats; those in the front row receive all the same as those in the back. Each person approaches with hands or mouth open like a beggar to be fed: Jesus has invited "the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind" to His feast every Sunday, has He not? And we can never repay Him for His generosity.

He therefore uses this parable—and even the Mass—to teach us that the hierarchy of Heaven is based not in prestige but in humility; the least shall be greatest, because they are most like Jesus—the Bridegroom (John 3:29)—and He is "meek and humble of heart" (Matthew 11:29). Will not those who are most like the Bridegroom share in His glory? Indeed! But when He came to our world "he humbled himself" and "because of this, God greatly exalted him," (Philippians 2:8-9). "Humble yourselves before the Lord," St. James writes, "and he will exalt you," (James 4:10).
