But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother ... was lost and has been found."

Lk 15:32

We were blessed with three children. As they were growing into adulthood, we had challenges with each of them. Oftentimes the challenges required money to get them out of a particular situation so they could get back on the right path. In looking back over those years, I am certain that each child did not receive the exact same help. But each child always received what they **needed** at the time.

I think that is an important part of the parable of the Prodigal son. I often heard that Gospel reading and felt badly for the older son. He was loyal, steadfast, hardworking, and loving to his father. But when his younger, ne'er-do-well brother returned, he was understandably upset that the fatted calf was slain, and a welcome home party was quickly arranged. The older son felt – well, betrayed by his Father.

We all want to feel that we are being treated fairly. We want to believe that if we are good and do the right things, we will be rewarded. And in the same way, we want to see "bad" people get punished! I mean, fair is fair, right?

On the other hand, when we fail, when we choose something that we know is not the right thing to do, we want to be forgiven. We want those whom we have hurt or offended to understand we just made a misstep and that we really are still good people. Sometimes our moral compass is very subjective.

When dealing with His children, our loving God takes a different approach. He loves us unconditionally. He sees into our hearts and knows our motives and understands our failures. In all things, He gives us what we **need**. He knows what is best for us and he brings those people, things, experiences into our lives to help us grow into the person He meant for us to be. Our vision is limited but His is not. He wants us to ultimately be with Him in paradise.

If we examine the story of the two brothers in today's Gospel, we can probably relate to both of them. Sometimes, like the younger brother, we want our way no matter who we might hurt in the process. Sometimes we are the older brother, who is miffed at being taken for granted. But our loving Father understands us. He sees beyond our petty, selfish behavior and offers forgiveness and another chance. His mercy is beyond our comprehension. All we can do is ask God's forgiveness, accept His merciful love, and do our very best to live His love in our daily lives.
