

The Call of the Prophets, ever ancient ever new.

Amos is the earliest of the prophets whose writings were passed to us in a single book. His appearance in Israel did not bear any of the marks of an acceptable social critic: he did not belong to the noble class and was not of a prophetic house. In true prophetic form, this revealed a way that God would call many of the prophets after Amos. Rather than bearing the mark of social status, they would be identified by their willingness to listen and respond to the call of God.

Occurring over a century after the Kingdom of David had split in two (Israel in the North and Judah in the south), Amos's writings initially are aimed at Israel, though eventually encompass Judah as well. Many of the criticisms Amos leveled at Israel would be echoed in the voices of the prophets who came after him. Truly, Amos's words still resonate today.

In particular, Amos comments on the Sabbath and how those who sought to build their own wealth looked to the Lord's day as a burden. In our current era, Sundays have taken on a character that it might do us good to reflect upon. As one preacher wrote (to paraphrase a friend of mine, who is a Lutheran minister): the Sabbath is not a reward for hard work, it is a reminder that our work will in many ways never be finished. The Sabbath reminds us that we are not God, and that taking rest from worldly things, calls us to the deeper rest we need found only in Christ. Ultimately, the Sabbath is a day that moves us from being productive to being present; it takes us from things of the world, bringing us to contemplate our presence in God, and God's presence with us.

It is somehow strange that the word of God that came through Amos almost 2,800 years ago still describes something of our own shortcomings. This, ultimately, is what makes people prophetic: not that their words were once correct, but that their words still ring true *because they are of God*. Amos's words speak to all people of all times because they call us to greater attentiveness of God's covenant. As it is written elsewhere, "those who have ears ought to hear."

Who we are as a people, is defined by the space we make in our lives to listen for God. What time do we spend listening for God in our days and weeks? Are we fooling ourselves in thinking that giving an hour every week to worship with the community is sufficient? Do we look forward to the Sabbath to satisfy our goals or God's? In Amos's prophetic words, may we receive God's invitation to grow in our attentiveness to Christ by making a new commitment to the Sabbath in our lives.


